Another amazing and busy week for the children in Reception! This week we have been focusing on the story 'Kind' by Alison Green to support our learning. 
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#### Year 1

What a lovely week we have had in Year 1. Each morning, we have joined together with Year 2 to practise the Christmas show, and it is looking and sounding fabulous! We cannot wait for you all to see it in a few weeks. In English, we began our new topic inspired by the book *Supertato*. Overnight, Evil Pea had come into our classroom and tied up all the vegetables! Year 1 helped to free them and did some lovely writing using a subject and a verb. Next week, we will be practising our capital letters, adjectives and much more! In maths, we completed our unit on shape. Year 1 have a good understanding of 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. They have even learned to use the vocabulary vertices! Any continued support on distinguishing between 2D and 3D shapes will be invaluable. In RE, we explored how some Christians show their values through actions such a charity. We learned that it is a very important part of Christianity and explore this through the parable of *The Sheep and The Goats*. To date, we have explored the charitable actions of Sikhs (Sewa), Muslims (Zakat) and Christians. Next, we will explore how these compare to our own worldviews. In Science, we went on a star hunt during the day. We could only see one in the sky... the Sun! Miss Delargy and I were so impressed by how many children already knew that the Sun is a star. We were doing this to answer the learning question: Where do the stars go in the daytime? At the beginning of the lesson, we gathered initial ideas and possibilities on post-it notes. By the end of the lesson, after we had done some scientific research, we learned that one of the post-it notes is true. In history, we reached the penultimate lesson of our unit on the Gunpowder Plot. We learned what happened after the Gunpowder Plot and how Guy Fawkes was arrested and taken to the Tower of London. We also discovered that the other plotters were also arrested, and their punishment was used to deter anyone else from committing treason. #### Year 2

What another fantastic week in Year 2. Rehearsals for our Christmas play are now in full swing and the children are doing really well remembering their lines and cues on stage. This week we have focused on adding some moves to the songs and introduced some props for the children to use. Next week, the children will start to wear their costumes for our dress rehearsal. A big thank you to everyone who has sent in the costumes for their child. If you have not done so yet, please can these be sent in on Monday. In our maths lessons, we have been continuing with our theme of shape. This week, the children have been focusing on 2D shapes. We looked at counting the sides and vertices found in these shapes. The children also had the chance to use the geo- boards to create some 2D shapes of their own which they showed great enjoyment with. We looked at lines of symmetry on shapes and used the mirror to help us find out whether a shape is symmetrical.

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In English, we have just started a non-fiction unit in which the class will be writing their own reports about pirates. In our phase one lesson, we identified the different features found in a non – fiction text. After that, we started our phase 2 lessons, we looked at statement sentences. We spoke about how statement sentences are the most common type of sentence and will tell the reader a fact or idea about a single topic. In computing, the children have practised how to take a good photograph. We spoke about how there are three things you need to think about when taking a photograph these are: positing, framing, and making sure that the subject is close enough to see what we are taking a photograph of. The children had the opportunity to take several different photographs and then review their photos to see if they could improve them in anyway. In Geography, the children have been looking at postcodes and spoke about how Coventry and Warwickshire use the postcodes starting with a CV. The children enjoyed using the tablets to find different postcodes of famous landmarks in and around Coventry.

In PSHE, continuing with our learning question 'what is bullying' we looked at the different types of bullying there is, where it can happen and what we should do if we are bullied, or we see bullying. We spoke about how bullying can make a person feel and why we should never deliberately exclude others.

#### Year 3

Another week of exciting learning has flown by in Year 3. As writers, we completed our persuasive texts encouraging people to visit Coventry. 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#### Year 4

It's been another busy week in Year 4 this week. In our science lesson on Monday afternoon, the children had great fun learning about our digestive system and how it works. They explored this practically by making poo! Next week, in science, we will be learning about our teeth and the importance of keeping them clean. On Wednesday morning, the class enjoyed a webinar from the author Serena Patel. Serena is the author of the Anisha - Accidental Detective series of books, the first of which we are using in class in our reading lessons. In the webinar, Serena talked about her journey to becoming a published author and the children also got the chance to plan their own mystery stories. In our English lessons, the children have been journalists, writing their own newspaper articles based on the mysterious events at Lake Tranquil in the film Marshmallows. The children have included: catchy headlines; opening paragraphs; and eyewitness quotes in their articles. In our maths lessons, we have continued our work on multiplication and division. This week we have been focusing on the 12 times table. To help at home, please continue to support your child to practise and learn their times table facts. As geographers, the class have compared the climate in Catalonia to the climate in the UK. In their PSHE lesson, the children have been talking about good and bad secrets and in their RE lesson, they have been learning about different forms of charity. This week was the last swimming lesson before the Christmas break. #### Year 5

Year 5 have been very busy writing stories this week. They have been writing science fiction stories based on meeting an alien. The children have been drafting their work one day, then editing it the following day. Our focus has been on adding detailed description and including verb, person and emotion, person sentence starters. It has been lovely to read their stories. What super writers they all are! In maths, we have continued to learn about fractions, comparing and ordering them. The children are thoroughly enjoying being creative in their PE lessons. They have been creating a space dance, incorporating the different components of the solar system. They have created individual motifs, worked in pairs and groups, as well as exploring different ways of travelling. In science, we have been finding out why the moon appears to change shape. This has included discovering how the lunar cycle works and learning new vocabulary like waxing and waning. You could ask your child to explain what these words mean. They could also keep a moon diary, noting the shape of the moon each night for 28 days.



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In history, we were amazed to find how many things were invented during Victorian times. They included the telephone, the motor car, postage stamps and many more things that we take for granted in our modern day lives. The children created a timeline in their books and thought about the importance of the inventions. We have lots of exciting learning coming up. Next Friday is our Victorian Day, where the children can dress up as Victorian children - please refer to the separate letter sent out about this. We have also asked for children to bring in card, and junk modelling materials for Design and Technology week (week beginning 9.12.24). Well done, Year 5, for a super week of learning! #### Year 6

What a brilliant week this has been! The children have been working hard, appear to have recovered from their adventures last week and have impressed me with their enthusiasm, particularly in English. As writers, the children have been preparing for their next piece of writing by reading a range of non-fiction books about dinosaurs. The children took part in a scavenger hunt where they explored a range of books in search of interesting and unusual facts. They learnt that even books that seemed less appealing contained interesting knowledge and were surprised to find information about climate and biomes in books based on dinosaurs too. The children also carried out a book critique where they assessed the impact of images, text and discovered their preferences for how they might present their information when they begin writing their own reports.

As mathematicians, the children have been continuing their exploration of fractions but this time they have been learning about multiplying them by integers as well as other fractions. The children explored a range of techniques in order to better understand this idea and were encouraged to use visual models such as bar models to show what was actually happening in a pictorial way.

In computing, the children were learning to create their own web sites on Google Sites. The children learnt about what made a website effective and user-friendly and then started to plan their own layout with a theme. Despite not being finished, there were some fantastic examples on show: gymnastics—themed, cookery and even holiday destination recommendations — how fantastic!

As geographers, the children were learning about estuaries and had many questions about how they were formed, maintained and whether they changed over time. I was so impressed with how the children conducted themselves during their investigation.

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
