### HADO

On Wednesday, Miss Bullock had the pleasure of taking some of our KS2 children to the HADO Arena to take part in an augmented reality competition. The children did brilliantly and won this round of the competition! They have been invited back to take part in the championship in a few weeks time! Well done to the team and thank you to Miss Bullock for attending the event with them.

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### Celebrating our Learning Reception

The children have had a wonderful week of learning and are beginning to get very excited about Christmas! We have been practising our Christmas songs which the children are so excited to perform later today and they have enjoyed making hats for this event too! To support our trip to Warwick Arts Centre next week, we have based lots of our learning around the book 'The Smeds and The Smoos'. We learnt how to mix red and blue paint together to create purple. We designed our own planets, junk modelled aliens and rockets, and even collaged a large Smed together! We have learnt the 'u' and 'r' sounds in phonics and have continued to practice reading and writing words with the sounds we already know. The children are becoming fantastic at this, and we have also introduced alien words, which are funny made-up words using different sounds. This has really supported them with identifying the sounds when reading. In maths we have used practical resources to help us understand our number bonds to 5, 1 more and 1 less. We had fun singing 5 current buns, 5 little frogs and 10 green bottles to support our understanding. After Christmas, we will be joining the rest of the school in our Friday celebration assemblies and have been practising lining up and sitting quietly in the hall to prepare the children for this in the new year. Each week, we will pick one child to receive a certificate. Parents will be messaged by the school office at the start of the week to invite you to the join the assembly but we keep this a surprise to the children until the Friday. Well done, Reception! 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### Year 1

Year 1 had their first dress rehearsal for the Christmas show on Tuesday. It was fantastic to see them in their costumes and it really helped to bring the show that extra sparkle. They have all done really well to learn the words to the songs and to do the actions at the same time. We are so excited for you all to see it next week! In English, we have been busy honing our writing skills ready to re-tell the story of *Supertato*. On Monday, we had a visit from Supertato, who had left a note, and some potatoes, asking us for help in keeping Evil Pea at bay. Supertato had asked us to turn the ordinary potatoes into our very own Supertatos to help with the task. We had to create a name for our super spuds and practise writing it using a capital letter. On Thursday, we had another message from Supertato, who told us that Evil Pea had enlisted an army of other evil peas! We went on a hunt around the school to find Evil Pea and his gang, but we could only find things that he had turned green and one photograph of him... However, our luck turned on Friday when we were able to capture Evil Pea and his minions and trap them all in jelly!! They are all now safely back in the freezer. For now. During all of this fun, we have practised different writing skills such as: using capital letters and full stops, using adjectives to describe a setting and using a subject and verb in the same sentence. Next week, we will be writing up our stories.

This week has also been Assessment Week. Year 1 have completed two maths papers (one arithmetic and one reasoning and problem solving), a reading paper and all 100 Year 1 High Frequency and Common Exception spellings. Miss Delargy and I have been very impressed, not only by their effort towards the assessments but by their enjoyment and discipline.

### Year 2

What another busy and brilliant week in Year 2. Year 1 and 2 have been putting the finishing touches to our Christmas performance - 'The Big Little Nativity'. All the children were really excited to put their costumes on for the first time this week! It was great to see how hard the children have worked over the last few weeks to get the show ready for our visitors to see. We know they cannot wait to show you their fantastic performance next week. We're all looking forward to seeing you on Wednesday afternoon - please can the children be back at school at 4:30, ready to start the performance at 5pm. In other lessons, the children have continued their work on shape in maths. We have carried on looking at symmetry this week with the support of a mirror to help us complete the rest of the shape. In English we are continuing with our learning by focusing on developing our non-fiction writing skills. We have looked at question sentences and created our own sentences based on what we would like to find out about pirates. As geographers, we continued our work at looking at maps. We spoke about how maps are covered in different symbols and how each symbol has a different meaning with it representing something in real life. The symbols are shown in a key so that we are able to identify them quickly on a map.



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We also had the chance to create our own symbols for a school, forest and pathway. In science, we have started to explore our new big question 'What is Cannon Park made of?'. We started at looking at the different materials found in our classroom and were amazed at the different types of materials we could find. The children showed great enjoyment when we explored the classroom and we spoke about how something can be made from more than one material. In computing, the children have been finding out about the impact of light on their photographs. The children had the opportunity to take different photographs with varying amounts of light. We used the torches to create an additional source of light when it was too dark to see the subject we were taking a photograph of. We found out that lighting is very important and is needed when taking a photograph. In PSHE, we have continued to look at bullying with a focus online. The children learnt that bullying can also happen online, and that this is called cyber bullying. We spoke about the importance of telling a grown up if they see anything online that makes them worried, sad or scared. They should also report and block the person who is being unkind to them online. Well done, Year 2 - what a hardworking week! ### Year 3

'It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas' in our Year 3 classroom. We are enjoying opening our class advent calendars and have been busy rehearsing for our Christmas concert. This week, during our maths lessons, we have continued to practise our times tables and discovered the relationship between the 2, 4 and 8 times tables. We made our own multiplication leaflets to help us visually see the doubling technique with these times tables.

As geographers, we discovered what earthquakes are and how they are caused. Using iPads, we researched how they are measured, the damage they can do, and which countries have the most earthquakes. In our computing lesson, we learned how to make our own stop-frame animation. Using the iMotion app, we discovered how animations are made through a series of frames. We had an animation of a person kicking a ball, pigtails growing and even a balloon flying! During our RE lesson, we learned how time is understood in Hindu worldviews. We discovered that time is seen as cyclical and having four 'yugas' or ages. We used a tower to demonstrate the 'Satya Yura' (or Golden Age) as being perfect, and how the 'Kali Yura' is unstable. As scientists, we investigated how magnets behave with one another. We played an 'attract' and 'repel' game to show how the opposite poles of a magnet attract, and the same poles repel.

As it has been assessment week in school, I would like to say how proud we are of all the children. They have shown our school values throughout the week. We wish you all a great weekend. Mrs Nagra, Mrs Murphy and Miss Williams



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### Year 4

This week the children have been completing end of term assessments in reading and maths. Mrs Amphlett and I were really pleased with how confidently the children approached these. They all certainly showed our school value of discipline - well done, Year 4. In our other maths lessons, the children have continued their multiplication and division work. This week learning about 'factor pairs' and also multiplying 3 numbers together. In our English lessons, the children have been studying the features of a persuasive text. As geographers, they have been comparing the physical and human geographical features of Barcelona (Catalonia) and Coventry (West Midlands) and as scientists, they have learnt the names and purpose of our different types of teeth. In their PE lessons, they have developed their hockey skills and have continued to develop their Roman-inspired dance routine. In PSHE, the class have talked about good and bad secrets, and how they should share a bad secret with a trusted adult. Next week, the children will be writing their persuasive piece of writing and in maths, they will be learning to multiply and divide by 10 and 100. Well done Year 4 - keep up the good work. ### Year 5

Year 5 have had an exciting week of learning. We started off with a trip on Monday afternoon to Warwick University. To support our science topic iabout Earth and space, we visited the university's planetarium. The children had great fun using an Astro Table to create their own solar systems and universe. They could add stars and even make them shooting stars. We also found out how to create a black hole! In the planetarium, we sat in the dark, looking up at the domed ceiling, where we saw all the constellations, the North Star and even a super nova! The camera zoomed in on the sun to see molten lava as well as the cooler parts of the sun. As if that wasn't enough, we got to see a huge telescope that the university use for their studies. The children were fantastic and it was certainly worth the walk to and from the university. Back in school, we have been finding out why we have night and day and why we have different time zones around the world. It's beginning to feel a bit like Christmas in Year 5 as we have been practising a song to sing to the rest of the school on our final assembly of the year. We've added in some musical instruments too, with some glockenspiels and jingle bells! To end the week, we had our Victorian Day. We all dressed up as Victorians and the children encountered some very strict teachers in Year 5. The lessons were quite different from normal too. There was lots of chanting of the alphabet and times tables and everyone had to write on slates with chalk. We had to do 'Drill' which wasn't as much fun as PE! The pretend cane was given and hands were inspected for cleanliness. In the afternoon, we made some Victorian Christmas tree decorations to decorate our classroom tree. 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### Year 6

It has been a busy week at school and the Year 6 children have taken part in their first full set of assessments to help prepare them for their tests in May. I have been so impressed by how the children conducted themselves throughout the process and it was delightful to see how pleased the children were based on our PSHE morning later in the week. I would also like to extend an additional thanks to Mrs. Kailey and Miss. French who helped me with supporting students throughout and after their assessments and played a pivotal role in ensuring that everyone's well-being was being well looked after. The children showed superb resilience and should be incredibly proud of themselves.

This week has not all been about tests though as the children learnt about coastal erosion as geographers. The class wrote about a range of factors that can influence erosion such as abrasion, hydraulic action and attrition. They found it fascinating that larger rocks eventually become tiny grains of sand. The children also discovered that sea arches are formed where coastal caves have been worn through by waves and that these eventually become sea stacks.

During computing, the children were learning about how copyright works from a digital standpoint. The children discovered that it was not okay to reproduce someone else's work for financial gain or without their permission or credit. Additionally, we learnt about fair use and studied scenarios where intellectual property had been used in a reasonable manner.

In R.E, the children were learning about what it meant to live well. They considered ideas such as whether self-care mattered more than rules or whether kindness was more important than being healthy. Following this, we arranged a formal debate for the children to share their views. We decided on party leaders who oversaw their teams and ensured that everyone knew the rules which ensured a fair process. I was very impressed with how articulate the class were and they are already looking forward to their next debate – well done everyone!
