












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#### Year 1

It was Show Week this week in KS1, and what a show it was! All the staff are still in awe of the amazing performance on Wednesday evening. The amount of hard work that the children in Year 1 and 2 put in is admirable and they should all be super proud of themselves. We are so glad that everybody who came to watch enjoyed it too. It was a great way to begin the Christmas festivities! In addition to the show, Year 1 have been working hard in their usual lessons. In history, we completed our topic on the Gunpowder Plot by throwing a celebration party. Our learning question was: Why do we still remember the fifth of November today? We made sparklers and tried toffee apples and created posters to explain why the event is still celebrated. The only difference we found in today's celebrations is that not everyone has to go to church like they did when King James I was on the throne. In English, we also completed a topic, this one on Supertato. Now that Evil Pea had been captured, we could get to re-telling the story without any more interruptions. The class used their writing skills to re-tell the story with as much detail as possible. They are fantastic! In science, we looked at nocturnal animals and found that there are loads of animals that are mostly active at night like, foxes and owls. The class each created a fact poster for their chosen animal. Another highlight of the week was when we went to watch The Smeds and The Smoos at The Warwick Arts Centre. It was a fantastic live performance, and all the children represented Cannon Park spectacularly. On Friday, in our Book Talk lesson, we reviewed the performance, and I think the results are very obvious everybody loved it! We look forward to seeing you next week for the final week of term. 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### Year 2

This has certainly been a very busy week for Year 2. First of all, it has been Design & Technology Week in school. The children have really enjoyed designing, making and evaluating their own 'Moving Monsters'. It was lovely to see the childrens' creativeness during the week and the enjoyment they showed whilst creating the different moving parts on their monsters. The children have shown great imagination and a lot of skill in the making of their monsters. On Tuesday afternoon, along with Reception and Year 1, we all went to the Warwick Arts Centre and had a super afternoon watching a performance of the famous children's book – The Smeds and the Smoos by Julia Donaldson. The children thoroughly enjoyed themselves and spoke highly of the performance. When we got back into school, the children could not wait to talk about the performance and would recommend it to their friends and family. The children's behaviour was outstanding and were a credit to the school showing all their school values during the afternoon. On Wednesday, Year 2 along with Year 1, gave a fantastic performance of our Christmas play – The Big Little Nativity. Their performance was amazing, and it was lovely to show everyone all the hard work they had put into their performance. It was lovely to hear from the families as well as staff members about how much they had enjoyed watching the performance. The children should be so proud of themselves as they had impressed all of us. Thank you to all of those who came and watched our performance and for the support you have given helping your child learn their lines. In maths, we have been continuing with our shape work focusing on 3D shapes this week, we have looked at the different features such as faces, vertices and edges found on these shapes. In English, we have looked at writing in the third person as we will be writing our own non chronological report on pirates. We spoke about how the writer would use this to write about other people. For instance, they would use the character's name or pronouns such as 'he' or 'she'. Afterwards, the children had the opportunity to write their own sentences based on pirates. On Thursday, we started to plan our non-chronological report so we could write them next week. The children enjoyed finding out about different pirates and found it surprising to hear that the treasure was not shared out equally between all the members on the ship. Finally on Thursday afternoon, Year 2 were visited by Steve Elton from St John's Church. The children came up with some questions they had thought of to ask Steve about his Christian worldview and had the opportunity for Steve to share a story form the Bible to the children.

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### Year 3

It has been a wonderful penultimate week in Year 3. In our English lessons, we watched a short festive film called 'Coming Home.' It tells the story of a Robin returning home from its Scandinavian migration across treacherous seas, to spend Christmas (and eat mince pies) with his 'loved one.' We sequenced the events in the film and then practised writing setting and character descriptions. Next week, we will write our own versions of the story. As mathematicians, we have been learning about related calculations i.e. if  $3 \times 3 = 9$ , then  $30 \times 3 = 90$ . We also started learning about how we can multiply a two-digit number by a one digit. As it has been Design and Technology Week in school, we were challenged with designing and making a bridge that will survive a natural disaster. We started the week learning about the different types of bridges and researched the name and location of famous bridges. We investigated the shape engineers use for strength and found that the triangle allows weight to be evenly spread throughout a structure. Then, came the exciting part of building our bridges. We cannot wait to put them to the test and evaluate them next week.

The highlight this week must be the Christmas Concert. I heard how brilliantly all the children performed on the ukeleles and I'm so proud of them, as I'm sure you all must be. Next week, we have an exciting, festive week planned. If you can send in an empty toilet roll by Wednesday, that will be great. (We won't tell you just yet what it will be used for!) ### Year 4

It has been Design and Technology Week this week in school. Year 4 have been designing and making their own tote bags. They all had to show lots of patience and perseverance as they sewed their bags together, and for many of the children it has been an opportunity for them to develop a brand new skill. In our English lessons, the children have really impressed me and Mrs Amphlett with the quality of their writing. They have had to write a piece of persuasive writing on: 'Should all monsters be banned?' They have had to decide if they are 'for' or 'against'; pose questions to the reader; use adverbials of cohesion; and organized their writing into paragraphs. Well done, Year 4 – great writing! In our maths lessons, we continued our work on multiplication and division. In particular, multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. Many of the children are starting to develop excellent recall of their times-tables facts. Over the Christmas holidays, it would be a great opportunity for all of them to keep practising their times tables. Please remember that TTrockstars is perfect for this. 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#### Year 5

Year 5 have been particularly showing the school values of enjoyment and teamwork this week as this week has been Design and Technology Week. Our question has been 'How can we earthquake-proof a building?' To start the week, the children were asked to create the tallest tower out of one piece of paper, using no glue or sticky tape! Next, they had to build towers using K'nex, Magnetix and spaghetti and marshmallows. We also found out about earthquakes and the damage they cause to buildings. This led onto finding out about how buildings can be made to reduce the effects of an earthquake. After experimenting with how to join art straws together, using pipe cleaners and playdough, we began designing our own earthquake-proof buildings. Combining their ideas, learning partners worked together to make their earthquake-proof buildings. But did they pass the wobble test? The buildings had to survive a 10 second wobble test to see if they could withstand an earthquake. Finally, it was time to evaluate our buildings, thinking about what worked well and what could be improved. In history, we thought about primary and secondary sources of information and we got to look at some real Victorian artefacts first hand. Just as historians do, we had to think about what we thought they were and what they were used for. There were some very interesting objects that got us a bit stumped! ### Year 6

Well, the penultimate week before Christmas has drawn to a close and, as always, the children have impressed me with their efforts in school.

This week, we've been carrying out our design and technology project, which was a study toys of yester year. The children looked at examples of mechanical toys which used cams to create movement and discovered that different cams performed different jobs affecting how the toy on top interacted with the user. Once the children had ample time to observe examples, they planned their own designs and ensured that they had some idea of the measurements that they would be following for their designs to come to life as accurately as possible.

With their plans at the ready, the children were introduced to the equipment that they would be using such as saws, bench hooks, hand drills and more. We learnt how to use these safely and got to work bringing our creations to life. At the time of writing, the children have had great fun so far working on their projects and are excited to share some photos of the finished articles in next week's final newsletter of the year. Watch this space!

As writers, the children have been finalizing their non-chronological reports after a lengthy drafting and editing process. Their final pieces are really taking shape and make for fantastic reading. Well done, everyone! The children also learnt about the prefix 'over' and found it interesting when comparing the difference between 'tired' with 'overtired'.
