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Celebrating our Learning Reception


What a wonderful first week back the children have had in Reception! They have been very excited to talk to us about what they have been up to over the Christmas holidays, and we would like to say a big thank you for continuing to support your child with their reading while they were at home! It really does make a difference. Our topic over the next couple of weeks is 'Winter' and the children have enjoyed listening to the story *King Winter's Birthday* to support their learning. We talked about the four seasons and focused on how winter is different to the others. We looked at weather symbols, talked about temperature, and the children have enjoyed checking the BBC weather website each day! The children have now learnt our five school values and they were excited to show teamwork together this week, so they decided all by themselves, to turn our home corner into a 'Harvester' restaurant! Year 1

Happy new year from the Year 1 class! What a lovely start to the new year it has been. We have enjoyed listening to what everyone got up to in the winter break, it sounds like they all enjoyed their two weeks off! The class have come back refreshed for a week for starting new topics. In English we have been looking at the story *You Choose in Space*, which we will be exploring to write a recount. So far, we have practised writing a simple sentence, using a subject and a verb and using sequencing adverbs. Next week, we will be learning how to use pronouns in place of names and using adjectives to describe a setting and a character. In maths, we are extending our learning from the Autumn term and learning to count to 20. We are developing our understanding the value of numbers from 11-20, and our knowledge of tens and ones. Next week, we will be exploring the numbers 11, 12 and 13. Any support at home with understanding tens and ones will greatly benefit them in lessons. In RE, we explored how some Muslim and Sikh people express their worldviews. We looked at what some people might wear, groups they might be part of and choices they make with what they eat to express their worldviews. We ended the week with some music, computing and handwriting. Miss Delargy and I continue to be impressed with Year 1's phonics and writing skills! 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Year 2

What a great first week back! Year 2 have quickly settled back into our school routines after the Christmas holidays and are working well with their learning across the curriculum. In maths, the children have started a new unit of work on money. They have been learning to identify the different coins and notes and found totals of different coins. If you could give your child chance at home to look at the different coins and notes and work out totals, this would be a great opportunity to consolidate their learning. In our English lessons, the class have been looking at a new book There is a Rangtan in my bedroom. The book is about the deforestation of the rainforests and destruction of orangutans' habitats to make way for palm oil plantations. After reading the book the children found it upsetting to hear what is happening in our rainforest and wanted to find out ways we could help save the orangutans. In science, we looked at different materials found in the classroom and why certain materials have been chosen to be used for their purpose. We spoke about the properties found in these materials such as glass being used for windows because it is transparent, and metal being used for a sink because it is waterproof. As historians, with Mrs Amphlett, the class have started exploring a new big question 'Who was Frank Whittle and why was his invention important'. The children looked who Frank Whittle was. We spoke about how Frank was born in Coventry and was a very important engineer and inventor. The children were amazed to hear that Coventry have paid tribute to Sir Frank's genius, with a statue of him standing under the 'Whittle Arches' sculpture outside the Transport Museum. They also had the chance to become inventors by creating their own paper planes and seeing whose paper aeroplane would travel the furthest. In Computing, we explored how photographs can be changed using different tools. We used an online resource to change the appearance using a filter effect of a photograph that had been taken. The children enjoyed using the different colour effects such as black and white, more blue and redder to change how the photograph finally looked. Finally, in RE we looked at salvation and why this is important to those with Christian worldviews. We looked at the Easter story and how Easter is celebrated by Christian's.

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Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the new year! The classroom has been abuzz with positive attitudes to learning and we are excited for the year ahead. In English, we started our new topic of *Robots & Machines* and read the story *Robot Stop*. The story grasped our imagination as we discussed what it would be like to have a robot do jobs for us. In preparation for writing our own robot stories next week, we have been learning why and how we write character and setting descriptions. During our maths lessons this term, we will continue to learn about multiplication and division, particularly using 2-digit and 1-digit numbers. This week, we have learning to multiply using the partitioning and column methods.

As scientists, we started our new topic namely 'What do rocks tell us about the way Earth was formed?' We discovered the names of different types of rock and grouped them into those that were natural and those that were man-made. Then, using a variety of natural rocks we made careful observations using magnifying glasses and used oil pastels to draw them. In our PE lesson, we enjoyed creating asymmetrical and symmetrical shapes in balances. This term, during our reading lessons, we will be reading one of our Y3 book recommendations – The Iron Man. After reading the blurb at the back of the book, we were left intrigued by the character and talked about what might happen in the story. We then followed a video of the illustrator Chris Mould and drew our own illustrations of the Iron Man. What a busy four days it has been! Well done Year 3, keep up the wonderful work. Year 4

First of all, Mrs Amphlett, Miss Dangi and I would like to say a very big thank you for all the lovely gifts that we received before we broke up – thank you so much. On Tuesday, it was great to welcome all the children back to school and hear about everything that they had been up to over the Christmas break. In our learning this week, we have continued our work on multiplication and division. The children have been learning how to multiply or divide 2- or 3-digit numbers by a single digit number. Knowing your times tables facts is crucial for this so please continue to support your child to learn their times tables at home – TTRockstars is perfect for this. In our English lessons, the children have been enjoying the book the *The Wolves in the Walls*. They have been learning how to use dialogue in a story and how to write a sentence with a relative clause. As historians, we have started a new topic on the Anglo-Saxons. In this week's history lesson, the children have found out where the Anglo-Saxons came from and have placed some key events on a timeline. In PSHE, the children have been thinking about and discussing how everyday situations can affect their feelings. In our Wednesday PE lessons this half-term, we will be doing gymnastics in the hall. Understandably this week, given the cold weather, some of the children had tights on underneath their joggers. For gymnastics, the children are expected to do this in their bare feet. Therefore, please could all children wear socks rather than tights for Wednesday PE. Next week, on Thursday, swimming lessons will start again. Also, next week, we will be welcoming a PGCE student teacher to Year 4, Miss Duffy-Moriarty. Well done, Year 4 - a great first week back and lots to look forward to this term. 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Year 5

What a fabulous first week back Year 5 have had! It's been an exciting start to the term, and the children have already shown great enthusiasm in their learning. In English, we've been creating chilly and chilling setting descriptions inspired by The Dreadful Menace. In maths, we've been working on adding and subtracting mixed numbers, and the children have shown great progress and perseverance. In geography, we've begun our new topic on Egypt, using our map skills to identify and plot both physical and human features of the country. In RE, we will be looking at Sikhi worldviews and have begun exploring what is unique to Sikh beliefs. We've also started learning about First Aid, focusing on how we can assist a casualty and get help in an emergency situation. This important skill is something we will continue to build upon in the coming weeks. It was a very close vote, and the children are thoroughly enjoying learning about life in 1994 - it's sparked some fascinating discussions. Year 6

Firstly, I would like to welcome everyone back after the holidays. I hope everyone had a restful break and made the most of their well-deserved time off. It has been wonderful to have the children back in school and see normality resume and its been great to see everyone return so keen and ready to learn - I have high hopes for a fantastic start to our spring term moving forwards.

As writers, the children have been refreshing their understanding of speech and dialogue in their writing. They have been exploring a range of ideas including using dialogue to move the action forward by creating suspense or surprises. They also learnt about how characters can be described through the way in which they speak such as the difference between how Hagrid might talk compared with Harry. It's been a wonderful creative experience that has enabled the children to produce some fantastic pieces of writing. As mathematicians, the children have been introduced to ratio. They have learnt to describe examples, represent ratio as sentences and have begun to explore how this idea links to multiplication, division and fractions. During computing, the children were learning about variables and how they can be implemented into a game. The children created a variable called 'score' and created a program which increased or decreased its score whenever it was pressed. The children look forward to continuing development on their games next week. Despite their history lesson not beginning until next week, the children were keen to explore war time artifacts that Mr. Young had brought into the classroom including a World War 2 fighter pilot helmet, artillery rangefinder and compass that could have been mounted on a Lancaster Bomber – the children look forward to learning more about these primary resources next week.
