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Reception

What a wonderful week the children in Reception have had! In phonics, we have learnt the digraphs 'sh' and 'th'. We had so much fun with the activities set up to support our learning, especially the shoe shop! We drew and wrote about sharks and even had a visit from a shark who helped us to understand the 'sh' sound. We learnt how to make and decorate paper aeroplanes and showed lots of enjoyment seeing who could throw their plane the furthest! We continued our topic 'Happy and Healthy' and learnt how to keep our teeth healthy, which also supported our understanding of the 'th' sound! We talked about the different foods that our teeth like and dislike as well as how to keep our teeth clean. In maths, we have been learning all about measuring, focusing on length and height. We were excited to measure ourselves to see how tall we are and had great fun challenging ourselves to build the tallest tower! We enjoyed our visit from our Year 6 buddies again on Thursday, and some of us even visited the Year 6 classroom with them where they had set up lots of exciting activities for us.

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Year 1

Year 1 have had an absolutely fabulous final week of Spring Term 1. It was our Art Week and our focus was drawing. Each day we have explored and practised a different skill that has helped us develop our mark making and drawing skills. We researched the artist Henri Rousseau and had a go at using his techniques to create lovely pieces of art. We ended the week by doing an observational drawing. We each had a section of Henri Rousseau's Tiger in a Tropical Storm that we recreated, using influence from the artist and the skills and techniques we have been practising all week, to create one big version of the famous painting. This was inspired by Henri Rousseau because, he used to work in blocks, moving onto a new section only after he had finished the one before. In English, we have been looking at features of traditional tales and having a go at using them ourselves. There have been some lovely character descriptions and immersive setting descriptions that made us feel like we were there! In maths, we have been building on our knowledge of doubles to calculate doubles and near doubles to 20. We will be continuing with this learning after half term, so any further practice at home with using number bonds to add and subtract within 20 will really support the children in securing their knowledge e.g., if 8 + 2 = 10, then 18 + 2 = 20. In RE, we had a special visitor. Brian from Humanists UK came in to talk to Year 1 and explain what a Humanist worldview is and where some Humanists, and other non-religious groups, may turn for guidance. It was a wonderful firsthand experience, and the class were a fantastic representation of Cannon Park School. Brian was very complimentary of the children's behaviour, and the welcome and respect they showed him. As always, Miss Delargy and I continue to be impressed by Year 1's enjoyment of learning and their evolving discipline. We are very excited to start Spring 2 and make some more lovely memories. 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Year 2

Year 2 have had a brilliant last week of this half-term. At the start of the week, the children had the opportunity finish off their flying carpet. All the children have written some fantastic reports on Orangutans. They included many of the key features needed for a non chronological report which include sub-headings, sections of information on the same topic, pictures with captions. They have also used the 3rd person and the present tense. Mrs Akthar and I really enjoyed reading all the children's report and it was fantastic to see all the amazing facts the children had remembered to use in their writing. It was great to see how much their writing has developed since the start of the year.

In maths, we have continued our unit on multiplication and division. We have looked at division looking particularly at dividing by 2. We also investigated double and halving different numbers or amounts. We discussed how when you double a number, you multiply by 2 and when you halve a number, you divide by 2. Using this knowledge, we looked at patterns between numbers and known facts such as, I know that double 2 is 4 so double 20 is 40.

As scientists, the children had a really fun afternoon carrying out an experiment that investigated what the best material would be for the roof of a house. The children used three different materials for their roofs and tested it with water to see whether it would be waterproof. It was fantastic to see the teamwork and the enjoyment the children showed throughout the afternoon. We found out that plastic was a great waterproof material to have for a roof.

Tuesday was Safer Internet Day which was based around the theme 'too good to be true'. We looked into how we can protect ourselves against internet scams and how we can stay safe. We investigated what personal information is and that this type of information is personal to ourselves and should not be shared online to others. The children read a story about someone who was scammed online via a digital game they were playing. We spoke about how when we see something pop up on our digital devices to always show it to a responsible adult who can help and sort it out for us. Finally, we came up with an important message from the session for everyone to remember when using a digital device. This is to think before you click. Thank you, Year 2, for a great half term! We hope you all have a well-earned rest everyone and we look forward to seeing you back after the holidays. Miss Softic and Mrs Akthar













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Year 3

What a wonderful week of learning we have had in Year 3. During our English lessons, we have enjoyed delving into poetry. Having read a variety of poems we identified key features within them including rhyming words, rhyming couplets and stanzas. Then, we wrote our own poems based on the Iron Man story. As mathematicians, we learned how we can add and subtract lengths which have different units of measurement. We then moved on to investigate perimeter and practised how to measure and calculate it. We even found the perimeter of our school playgrounds and barn!

We followed a recipe to make safer passwords and learned top tips for being safe when gaming. In our science lesson, we discovered why Mary Anning became known as the greatest fossil hunter in the world. As historians, we went on a fact-finding hunt to find out what life was like in the Iron Age. During our PE lesson this week, we enjoyed a session of cosmic yoga which helped to relax us after a busy day of learning. Well done Year 3, we wish you all a lovely, restful half-term. It has been another busy week in Year 4 this week. The week got off to an exciting start on Monday: in their science lesson the children had great fun making telephones with two paper cups and a piece of string. They investigated how sound waves travelled from one cup, down the string to the second cup, and into their ears. This week, in their English lessons, the class have really impressed us with their great writing. They have been writing instructions about 'How to catch a wolf?'. In their instructions, they have included: a detailed 'what you need' list; relative and subordinate clauses to add more detail; and time adverbials to show the sequence of instructions. In our maths lessons, we have been continuing our unit on fractions. This week, the class have been learning about mixed number fractions and improper fractions. We will be continuing with fractions after half-term. As historians, the children found out about the different gods worshipped by the Anglo-Saxons and produced a fact-sheet on a god of their choice. The children were also surprised to find out that there were many similarities between Anglo-Saxon religious festival and modern Christian festivals, such as Christmas and Easter. In our PE lesson, the children showed great ability on the gymnastic apparatus. In computing, the children investigated how they could change photos for different uses and in RE, the class learnt about the way Christians explain the Holy Trinity. 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Year 5

What a lovely half term we've had in Year 5. It seems to have flown by! In English this week, we have enjoyed the story 'Wished' by Lissa Evans. After doing some comprehension work, we planned and wrote our own stories involving a wish. Lots of children wished for an unusual pet. We had orangutans, dragons and all sorts! Year 6

As writers this week, the Year 6 children had their newspapers 'published' and final copies have been placed in their books. They look very professional and make for entertaining ready. Additionally, the class have been creating a piece of persuasive writing this week and have been carefully considering their audience and purpose. Some children have decided to stickwith the Harry Potter theme and write an enrolment letter for Hogwarts or an advert for a shop in Diagon Alley; Others, however, have chosen to write about their favourite football club with a view to welcoming families for a day out who might be in the area. It has been wonderful to see their enthusiasm throughout this shorter topic and the results have been brilliant despite having just a week to complete them.

As mathematicians, the children have been learning about decimals and how to partition, round and solve reasoning problems with them. They have been using their timetable facts to support them but it has been quite clear to see that they have a good understanding of this topic and will be ready to tackle a mixture of fractions, decimals and percentages after the half-term break.

Working as historians this week, the children were learning about what evacuees experienced during World War 2 from first hand sources. They also cross-referenced this with the implementation of propaganda posters which were used to help convince parents not to bring their children back to the larger cities. The children finished off by creating their very own propaganda posters.

This week has seen Cannon Park host Safer Internet Day. The Year 6 children took part in an engaging live lesson which helped them to understand important concepts to be aware of including how to protect themselves against Phishing and how to create safer passwords. The class was also visited by the police who delivered an informative talk about all things online safety including tips on how to handle uncomfortable situations online including being spoken to by strangers. It was brilliant to see how engaged the children were throughout these sessions.

If you need paper, it will be available in your classroom for you to take home. Please bring in your learning after half term and pass it to Mr Ray.



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
