The children in Reception have had another busy and exciting week of learning! This week, we have based our learning around pirates and enjoyed reading lots of stories to unlock our imaginations. We used our creative skills to make pirate hats and eye patches. We made maps with instructions and followed each other's to try and find the hidden treasure! We showed teamwork and discipline by creating a pirate ship together and enjoyed making flags and signs for it too! We had a great day on Wednesday when we visited Year 1 for the day. Miss Brett & Miss Delargy were amazed with our writing, and how we understood and showed the school values throughout the day. 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Year 1

In maths, we finished our topic on Place Value to 100 by comparing any two numbers between 0-100. Again, we impressed all the grownups with our knowledge, but especially with our reasoning skills. We are definitely ready to move onto the next unit which is money. Nowadays, we don't see or use money as much so any exposure or support at home with recognising the value of different coins and notes will really help us in our lessons. In history, we explored how bicycle design in the Victorian era changed and developed. We especially enjoyed learning about the one called 'boneshaker'. Did you know that its wheels were made of iron, and the pedals were on the front wheel, so riders could feel ever bump, and it would feel very uncomfortable and shaky, hence the name. A highlight of the week was in RE, watching our friends in the class share pictures of them enjoying different ceremonies. We learned so much about each other and the details of different Hindu, Sikh, Christian and Jewish ceremonies. The grownups really enjoyed how excited and enthusiastic we were to share and to listen. Thank you, Year 1, and to your grownups for bringing in those wonderful memories. Finally, Wednesday was Transition Day, and we all really enjoyed spending the day in our new class with our new teachers. We had so much fun! Year 1 are ready for the next stage of school, but we are so happy that we have still got a few more weeks to enjoy together! 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
Year 2

We can't believe that we have two weeks left in Year 2. This year seems to have flown past. This week the children have had an amazing week of learning. In English, the children have written out their recounts based on the story of 'The Tunnel'. It was lovely to read and see the children's writing and how much their writing has developed over the course of the year. They have all worked hard to include many of the grammatical features that have been taught throughout the year and have thought about how to further develop their writing. As Mathematicians, we have been continuing with our theme of statistics. We have been looking at drawing and interpreting pictogram where the key has a total of one. We spoke about how when looking at pictogram it is important to look at the key as this shows us the value of each picture. The children have shown great enjoyment, and it has been wonderful to see their confidence grow with the topic. As Scientists, this week we have been exploring the learning question 'How does light and water affect plant growth?'. We explored the learning question by setting up an experiment to see whether these factors would have an impact upon a plant's growth. We decided to set up four different plants pots within the classroom focusing on removing one of the factors to see what will happen to the plant. We will be observing the seeds over the course of the next couple of weeks to see what will happen. In Computing, we focused on sequences and considered the importance of the order of instructions within a sequence. We had the chance to create sequences using the same instructions but used them in different orders. Finally, we tested these sequences using the beebots to see how the different orders affect the outcome. On Wednesday, the children spent the day with their new teachers Mrs Nagra and Miss Roberts in Year 3 all the children came back really excited and are looking forward to moving up to Year 3. We have also been busy writing about our time in Year 2 for our reports, which we hope you will enjoy reading with the children's report. Next week, is Design & Technology week in school. Year 2 will be designing their own fridge magnets. To help at home please could you investigate any magnet you have at home and also send in on Tuesday any fridge magnets that you have so all the children can have a look at them. 

It was a brilliant lesson and wonderful to see the children engaging with real life agendas.

Within R.E, the children were exploring the idea of 'truth'. They carried out a fantastic investigation into the etymology of the word and looked up its definition. We explored some rather complex ideas such as truth is not always what makes people feel good and is not always what is understandable. The children even considered the idea that truth is also not defined by the belief of a majority. We concluded that truth must correspond to reality and truth must match its object. It was an enjoyable lesson that taught the children to reflect on their own ideas about what truth means.



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Later in the week, Year 6 watched the Summer Music Concert Rehearsals and were thrilled by all the wonderful musicians that were taking part. Year 6 even had many of their own musicians taking part including pianists, drummers, choir members and more. 
