## Celebrating our Learning Reception

Wow! What a wonderful week of learning the children have had in Reception! This week we have based our learning around the book *The Gruffalo*, which has also supported our understanding of learning the *g* sound. We used our creative skills to make paper plate Gruffalo masks, and our drawing skills to draw the different characters. We were very impressed with the details the children included in their drawings! We have also been practicing writing the sounds we have learnt so far in our daily handwriting lessons. In maths, we have been identifying and naming 2D shapes and enjoyed going on a walk around school to look for different shapes in our environment. On Wednesday we spoke to the children about fireworks and how to stay safe. They had lots of fun creating sparklers using sparkly ribbon, straws and lolly pop sticks, and enjoyed painting colourful firework pictures! The children also enjoyed creating poppies for Remembrance Day, and some of them will soon be on display inside Cannon Park shopping centre!

We have also spoken to the children this week about the importance of eating their lunch and why our bodies need food. We talked about trying new foods that are on the lunch menu too!

At home, please continue to support you child with blending the sounds they have learnt. The inside cover of their reading book is a great place to support you with this, and the children are used to doing this with us in school. ### Year 1

It has been a lovely first week back after half term in Year 1. In English, we have started a new topic all about poetry. Our learning is inspired by the book A Great Big Cuddle by Michael Rosen, which contains lots of different poems written by him. So far, we have enjoyed a new poem each day, learned how to read a poem aloud by using emotion and intonation and played games as an introduction to rhyming words. We are having so much fun, and we are really looking forward to learning more about what makes a poem and having a go at writing our own one next week. In maths, we consolidated our understanding of addition by solving addition problems of adding more and adding together, and we started to look at subtraction by finding the missing part of a part-whole model. In science we introduced a new topic: Why does it get darker earlier in Winter in Coventry? sparking curiosity about seasonal changes. Next week, we are going to explore how shadows are formed. In RE, we discussed the importance of Zakat, understanding how generosity and caring for others are central values to those with Muslim worldviews. In PSHE, we focused on friendship and making thoughtful choices, learning that saying "sorry" is important, but avoiding hurtful actions in the first place is even better. In computing, we moved on from practising our mouse skills to developing our keyboard skills. We are becoming experts at identifying the letters on the keyboard and building confidence in typing and navigating digital tools. In Book Talk, we began exploring a new story called Catch that Chicken by Atinuke, and discussed how the book made us feel, as well as how the characters might be feeling; helping us think deeply about emotions and empathy while developing our oracy skills through sharing ideas and listening to others. In music we listened to the songs that will be in our KS1 Winter Show, and we started to learn the title song ahead of rehearsals that start next week! We hope you all have a wonderful weekend and we look forward to seeing you next week. Miss Brett and Miss Delargy

### Year 2

It has been lovely to welcome the children back after half-term and we have had another wonderful week of learning. In our maths lessons this week, the children have been learning how to add and subtract pairs of 2digit numbers across a 10. The children have answered subtraction calculations where they had to exchange one ten for 10 ones in order to complete the calculations or within addition exchanging 10 ones for a 10. In English, this week we have continued to look at poetry, focusing on chocolate cake by Michael Rosen. For our hook lesson, we watched Micheal perform his poem and it was great to see the children enjoying his performance. We then looked at the way he performed and how he made it interesting for the audience. We explored the way he used his voice, his action and expressions whilst reading the poem. On Tuesday, the children had the opportunity to create different freeze frames from key parts of the poem to show the different emotions throughout the poem. On Wednesday, we focused on our voice when delivering the poem and practised reading the poem in different ways. Finally, on Thursday we incorporated all the skills we had learnt and performed a part of the poem to the rest of the class. Mrs Akthar and I were amazed with all of the children's performances, and it was wonderful to see the enjoyment and teamwork they had shown throughout the week. In science, it was our last lesson on where would an animal choose to live? In the lesson, we looked at how do we know whether something is living, dead or never been alive? The children explored life processes by looking at how living things can tell us if something is living, dead or has never been alive. They also learnt the acronym MRS GREN to remember all the different life process they are. As geographers, we began to look at our new big question 'What do you find exciting about Cannon Park'. The children looked at different significant places to visit in and around Coventry. It was lovely to hear from the children about where they had visited as well as where they would like to. In RE this week, we have been exploring the question 'Do all Christians use the Bible in the same way'. The children learnt that there are many different examples of Bibles and this is an important book for those with Christian worldviews. Also, we looked at one of the stories from the Bible 'Noah's Ark'.

We spoke about how the story shows teamwork and resilience. On Thursday for outdoor learning day, the children had the opportunity to practise their addition and subtraction in the form of a relay race. Year 3

A warm welcome back after half-term. We hope you all managed to have a lovely break with your families. We have had a very busy and exciting week of learning in Year 3. During our English lessons, we have loved exploring poetry inspired by Michael Rosen's 'Jelly Boots Smelly Boots'. Using a different poem from the book, each day, we have learned that poetry is about sound, rhythm and feelings, not just rhyming words. We discussed a variety of poems and talked about what we liked/disliked about them, the patterns we found, questions we had, and the effect they had on us. We wrote our own food temptation poems using repetition and onomatopoeic words and learned how visualisation is used in poetry. As mathematicians, we have started our learning of 'Multiplication and Division'. This week, we learned how to make equal groups, how to use arrays, and developed our understanding of multiples of 2, 5 and 10. On Thursday, it was Outdoor Classroom Day, so we took our maths lesson outside onto the playground. We used leaves to practise our times tables and played a game to understand facts about multiples of 5 and 10. In our learning of science, we started our new topic on 'Forces & Magnets' and investigated different forces at work in our everyday lives. As animators, we created our own flip book animations to show how a picture can move. As gymnasts, we learned about what is meant by 'points' and 'patches' and created symmetrical shapes in balances on patches. Well done, Year 3, you have made a fabulous start to the term. ### Year 4

It was lovely to welcome the children back to school this week. They have all quickly settled back into our familiar routines. This week in our English lessons, we have had a focus on the poet Michael Rosen, following on from our trip to the Belgrade Theatre earlier this term. The children have written three poems inspired by Michael Rosen: The Rhythm of Life, School Haiku and the Words are Ours. They have also performed their poems to the class and created a display in the classroom of their work. In our maths lessons, we have started a new unit on multiplication and division. We have recapped the 3 times table and then moved on to the 6 times table for the first time. On Thursday morning, we took our maths lesson outside and had fun practising the 6 times table on the playground in different energetic ways! To help at home, please can you support your child to learn their 6 times table and the associated division facts. As scientists, we have started learning about the human digestive system. This week we have learned the scientific names and what jobs they do. As geographers, the children have found out about the region of Catalonia in Spain. In subsequent lessons, we will be comparing it to Coventry and the West Midlands. In our RE lesson, the children have learnt about the role charity plays in different world views; in PSHE, the children have considered how their behaviour affects others; and in computing, they have learnt how to programme a screen turtle. ### Year 5

Year 5 have had a great start to the half term. In English, we have been busy writing performing and writing poems inspired by Michael Rosen. We read the poem Words are ours and looked for rhyming couplets. We explored our own rhyming words and even included some nonsense words. In pairs, we created pairs of rhymes and put these altogether to make a class poem. Everyone enjoyed performing this together, sitting in a circle. Next, we looked at the poem What's in your bag? We explored rhymes and spelling patterns to create our own word bank of rhyming words. Using these, we wrote our own individual verses for the poem and copied them up in neat, joined handwriting. In maths, we have been multiplying and dividing whole numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000, thinking about which way the digits move when we do this. On Thursday, it was Outdoor Learning Day. We took our maths lesson outside and enjoyed practising our estimating and measuring skills on the school field. We learnt a special technique to measure the height of a tree without having to climb it! The children showed great teamwork, helping each other to measure. In PE, we began a football unit for outdoor games and started working on a space dance in the hall. In history, we began our Victorians topic by finding out all about Queen Victoria. We created our own fact files by creating a tracing of Queen Victoria, using facts about her instead of lines. In RE, we discussed what we know about Jesus and where we got our knowledge from. We also thought about different world views of Jesus. In PSHE, we began a new unit about money and what decisions people can make with it.
