Celebrating our Learning

Reception

Another amazing and busy week for the children in Reception! This week we have been focusing on the story 'Kind' by Alison Green to support our learning. We talked about our emotions and how different acts of kindness from others can make us feel. We created cards and posters to show what we think makes a person kind and a good friend. It was also lovely to see how kind the children this week were with welcoming a new member of our class and making them feel happy and part of our school. In phonics this week, we have been focusing on reading and writing words with this week's new sounds, 'u' and 'r'. The children had so much fun using their creative skills when making a class robot together! In maths we have been learning number bonds to 5 and deepening our understanding with how many ways we can make numbers to 5. We enjoyed using cubes and number blocks to support this. We have also been impressed with the children's sequencing skills when ordering and representing numbers to 20 as a challenge. We even used the school tablets to practise our subitising skills this week! As there have been lots of coughs and colds in Reception this week, we have been talking about how important it is to wash our hands and to cover our mouths when coughing. We have shown the children how to blow their noses too! This is something that we would greatly appreciate your support with at home to help your child become more independent. Thank you! Year 1

This week has been full of exciting learning! In English, we've been practising our writing skills by using subjects, verbs, and adjectives to make our sentences more interesting. Supertato sent us another letter—Evil Pea is still on the loose! He told us to keep our eyes peeled for any signs of mischief. In maths, our focus has been on subtraction, especially using a number line. We explored how jumping backwards helps us understand taking away. In history, we learned all about Guy Fawkes and why he is still remembered today. The children enjoyed plotting the events of the Gunpowder Plot on a timeline; it really helped us see the order of what happened. In science, our big question was: Where do stars go during the day? We started by sharing what we thought (our teachers were so impressed with the ideas we shared), then went outside to look for stars. We couldn't find any, not even the closest star to Earth (the Sun) because it was so cloudy! We discovered that stars don't go anywhere; they're always there, but the sunlight makes it too bright to see them during the day. In RE, we began a new topic on philosophy and explored the idea of happiness with Aristotle. We learned that happiness isn't just about what we enjoy, it also comes from being kind to others and to ourselves. Finally, the countdown to our Christmas Show is on! The performance is looking fabulous, and we can't wait for you to see it in just a couple of weeks. We hope you all have a wonderful weekend and we look forward to seeing you on Monday. Year 2

What another fantastic week in Year 2. Rehearsals for our Christmas play are now in full swing and the children are doing really well remembering their lines and cues on stage. This week we have focused on adding some moves to the songs and introduced some props for the children to use. Next week, the children will start to wear their costumes for our dress rehearsal. A big thank you to everyone who has sent in the costumes for their child. If you have not done so yet, please can these be sent in on Monday. In our maths lessons, we have been continuing with our theme of shape. This week, the children have been focusing on 2D shapes. We looked at counting the sides and vertices found in these shapes. The children also had the chance to use the geo- boards to create some 2D shapes of their own which they showed great enjoyment with. In English, we have started to look at a new book - 'The Pirate Cruncher' written by Jonny Duddle. The class enjoyed making their own treasure maps and drawing their own pirate captain, who they then wrote some super descriptions about. It was fantastic to see the children's confidence with their writing with them using 2 adjectives, conjunction and even adverbs to begin their sentences.

In computing, the children have practised how to take a good photograph. We spoke about how there are three things you need to think about when taking a photograph these are: positing, framing, and making sure that the subject is close enough to see what we are taking a photograph of. The children had the opportunity to take several different photographs with the support of a frame to position their photographs correctly and then review their photos to see if they could improve them in any way. In geography, the children have been looking at postcodes and spoke about how Coventry and Warwickshire use the postcodes starting with CV. The children enjoyed using the tablets to find different postcodes of famous landmarks in and around Coventry. In RE, we explored the learning question 'Was Jesus a Christian'. The children learnt that Jesus and his followers were Jews following the Jewish faith. We found out that Jesus was a teacher like many other Jewish teachers at the time and they would have called him 'Rabbi' (the name given to Jewish teachers). We explored the Bible and the learnt that there are four important books called the Gospels. These are Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. They all tell a slightly different account of the life of Jesus.

Year 3

What a wonderful week of learning we have had in Year 3. As writers, we finished off our instruction texts detailing how to make delicious hot chocolates. We used time conjunctions, adverbial phrases and imperative verbs in our writing. As mathematicians, we have been learning about greater multiples of 10 and scaling facts. For example, if $3 \times 4 = 12$ then we know $3 \times 40 = 120$. To end the week, we learned how we can multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number using the partitioning method. Next week, we will learn how to multiply with exchanges and the link between multiplication and division. As scientists, we investigated if all magnets have the same strength. We developed our questioning skills by thinking of questions before we put our enquiry to the test. During our reading comprehension lessons, we are nearing the end of *Ember Spark and the Thunder of Dragons*. We have been gripped with the adventures Ember has been on to save the magical beasts. During our geography lesson, we considered why people would choose to live near a volcano. Did you know volcanic soil is extremely nutrient rich and is perfect soil for growing crops? In our RE lesson, we discovered why nature and seasons are important to Pagan worldviews. We created a season's wheel and included what each season signifies to Pagans. Year 4

It was an exciting start to the week for Year 4. We went down to the Spinney for our 'Campfire Experience'. The children enjoyed toasting marshmallows and drinking hot chocolate. They even got to listen to a campfire story. A big thank you to Mr Higgs for his help with this activity. The purpose of this activity was to set the scene for our next writing topic. In our English lessons, this week and next, we will be building up to writing a newspaper article based on the short film *Marshmallows*, which is all about a boy who is camping in the woods and a (friendly) monster comes along and pinches his marshmallows! On Thursday afternoon, we welcomed a group of students from the University of Warwick's 'Engineers without Borders' group. They spoke to the children about different sources of electricity and the importance of access to electricity. Then the children partnered up with children from Year 6 to design and make their own miniature wind turbine. The children really enjoyed their session and showed excellent teamwork when working with each other. We certainly have some budding engineers at Cannon Park! In our maths lessons, we have focused on the 12x times table. We have now gone through all the times tables up to 12 x 12. Please continue to encourage your child to practise their times tables at home. TTRockstars is perfect for this. Their login in details are stuck into their reading diaries. As scientists this week, the children have looked at the nutritional information on food packaging and learnt about the importance of a balanced diet. As geographers, the children have compared the human geographical statistics of Catalonia and the West Midlands (population, major cities, currency, economy, etc). In our PE lesson, we have continued to develop a Roman-themed dance. In our computing lesson, the children explored repeating patterns and in RE, the children have learnt about the importance of non-violence to Quakers. Well done, Year 4 - another great week. Year 5

Year 5 have had a great week. We started the week with some reading and SPAG assessments. As writers, we have been practising using verbs to start a sentence, as well as using a range of different sentence openers that we might use at the beginning of a paragraph. To inspire us with our brilliant sentence openers, we watched *Lifted*, a short animation about aliens. In maths, we have continued with our fractions topic, learning to add and subtract fracti ons with the same or different denominators. The children are thoroughly enjoying being creative in their PE lessons. They have been creating a space dance, incorporating the different components of the solar system. This h as involved creating individual motifs, working in pairs and groups, as well as exploring different ways of travelling. In history, we found out that there were an amazing amount of inventions in Victorian times! Many of these are things that we still use today, all be it in a more advanced technological form. We had to solve riddles to connect the invention with the year it was invented. Next, we added our inventions to a timeline in the form of a train track. On Friday, Year 5 enjoyed an exciting Micro:bit workshop, kindly sponsored by Metro Bank. Each child was provided with a Micro:bit computer and had the chance to explore coding and digital creativity through hands-on activities. Year 6

As writers this week, Year 6 have been putting the finishing touches to their descriptive settings. They have truly impressed me with the range of vocabulary shown and I have been particularly impressed by their use of personification to bring their writing to life.

As mathematicians, the children have been learning how to multiply fractions by integers. They discovered that when this occurs the fraction gets bigger and they also learnt that an integer was any whole number. Later in the week, the children discovered that multiplying fractions by other fractions actually made fractions smaller. They were shown visual models to help describe this and did a fantastic job at solving a range of problems linked to this topic and they were able to spot mistakes and understand misconceptions. Well done, everyone.

As scientists, the children were learning about natural selection. They learnt that organisms that reproduce usually create near identical copies of themselves but genetic mutations can occur within their offspring which can cause subtle variations in appearance and traits. The children then explored examples of how certain bugs would be favoured as food for birds due to their colour whereas others may camouflage better within their environment causing their traits to become more desirable. It was an interesting lesson with lots of brilliant thinking and discussions.

Within PSHE, the children explored case studies of students facing worries including high expectations within a sports team, homework at secondary school and travelling alone on the bus. The children shared the concerns an individual might face and how they might be feeling. They then learnt about reappraisal and were taught how to consider things from an alternative perspective which allowed them to change worries into positives with solutions. Well done, Year 6!
