Year 1

What an exciting week it has been! It was Christmas show week, and the children were thrilled to share with everyone in school, and at home, the wonderful work they've been doing. In maths, we began a new topic on shape. Building on our Reception knowledge, we practised recognising and naming 2D and 3D shape s. Then, we sorted them into groups by colour, shape, number of sides, and vertices. In English, we received another letter from Supertato and even had a visit from Evil Pea! He had released his army of peas from the freezer, and they were all over the classroom! We helped Supertato trap them in jelly to stick them in their place. Afterwards, we used adjectives to describe the jelly setting and planned our retelling of the story, which we'll write next week. Later in the week, we started this term's Design & Technology project: How can we create a vehicle to travel around the UK? We explored moving toys and pop-up picture books to spark ideas and decided on a festive twist—our vehicle will be Santa's Sleigh! On Friday, we practised joining two different materials and continued the festive fun by making Christmas cards for our families. We can't believe next week is the last week of the Autumn term! Year 2

This has certainly been a very busy week for Year 2. First of all, it has been Design & Technology Week in school. On Monday, the children looked at moving pictures with a pivot and lever. We spoke about how the pivot allows the lever to move from side to side in an arc. We learnt that the pivot is a fixed point. This means that it does not move, but it allows the lever that is attached to it to move. The pivot is made by making a hole in the lever and the background scene and inserting a paper fastener to join them together. The children had a go at making their own moving dinosaurs using a pivot for their moving body parts. On Wednesday the children really enjoyed designing their moving monster and are looking forward to making their monster next week. It was lovely to see the children's creativeness come to life and the enjoyment they showed whilst designing their monster. On Tuesday, Year 2 along with Year 1, gave a fantastic performance of our Christmas play – Baarmy Bethlehem. Their performance was amazing, and it was lovely to show everyone all the hard work they had put into their performance. It was lovely to hear from the families as well as staff members about how much they had enjoyed watching the performance. The children should be so proud of themselves as they have impressed all of us. Thank you to all of those who came and watched our performance and for the support you have given helping your child learn their lines. In maths, we have been continuing with our shape work focusing on 2D shapes this week, we have looked at symmetry to complete the shapes and sorting 2D shapes according to their properties. Next week in maths, we will be looking at 3D shapes and will be looking at their faces, edges and vertices.

In English, during the first half of the week the children have written their own pirate adventure story based on the Pirate Cruncher. The children have blown Mrs Akthar and I away with their writing. It was fantastic to see the children's confidence with using the range of different grammatical skills such as adjectives, adverbs and conjunctions in their writing. It has been brilliant to see how much their writing has developed already over the course of a term. For the second half of the week the children have started their writing focus with the aim of writing a non-chronological report based on Pirates. We became detectives and looked for the different features found in a non-chronological piece of writing. Next, the children looked at writing their own statement and questions sentences, which they will use when writing their own report up next week.

Year 3

Wow, what a penultimate week we have had in Year 3. As it has been D&T week in school, we were challenged with designing and making a bridge that will survive a natural disaster. We started the week learning about the different types of bridges and their uses. Using iPads, we enjoyed learning the names and locations of famous bridges from around the world. We investigated the shape engineers use for strength and found that the triangle allows weight to be evenly spread throughout a structure. Then, came the exciting part of designing and building our bridges. Miss Roberts and I were amazed with the engineering skills at work. Another highlight this week, was the Christmas Concert. Led by Miss Brett, all the children sang beautifully as they played on the glockenspiels. Several of our children were also a part of the school choir and continued to show discipline with practising the songs every week. I'm sure you will agree, they all did a remarkable job!

In our other learning, we wrote our persuasive texts encouraging people to visit Coventry. We researched facts about different attractions and then used these in our writing to entice readers to come and explore our city. As mathematicians, we have learned how to divide a 2-digit number by a 1-dgit number using the partitioning method.

Year 4

On Wednesday afternoon, Year 4 got us all into the Christmas spirit with their wonderful performance on the glockenspiels during our Christmas concert. We also need to say a big "thank you" to Miss Brett who has been teaching the children music this term on Wednesday afternoons. All the children are really enjoying their music lessons with Miss Brett and it was great to see the progress they have all made on the glockenspiels. It has also been Design & Technology week in school. The children have been designing and making their own tote bags this week. On Monday, they investigated different types of bags. On Tuesday, they came up with some initial designs and then they created their final design for their bag. On Thursday and Friday, they used their sewing skills to make their own bag. They all showed excellent perseverance and patience as they developed this tricky skill. Rightly, they were all very proud of the finished results. In maths, the children have learnt how to multiply and divide by 10. Next week, they will learn how to multiply and divide by 100. In our English lessons, the children have been developing their writing skills, using the John Lewis Christmas advert 'Moz the Monster' as a stimulus. Next week, they will be writing a narrative based on 'Moz the Monster'. In our PE lessons this week, the children have shown excellent teamwork to add a wholeclass 'cannon' to our roman-inspired dance and have also developed their passing and catching in Danish long ball. Year 5


Year 5 have been particularly showing the school values of enjoyment and teamwork this week as it has been Design and Technology Week. Our question has been 'How can we earthquake-proof a building?' To start the week, the children were asked to create the tallest tower out of one piece of paper, using no glue or sticky tape! Next, they had to build towers using K'nex, Magnetix and spaghetti and marshmallows. We also found out about earthquakes and the damage they cause to buildings. This led onto finding out about how buildings can be made to reduce the effects of an earthquake. After experimenting with how to join art straws together, using pipe cleaners and playdough, we began designing our own earthquake-proof buildings. Combining their ideas, learning partners worked together to make their earthquake-proof buildings. But did they pass the wobble test? The buildings had to survive a ten second wobble test to see if they could withstand an earthquake. Finally, it was time to evaluate our buildings, thinking about what worked well and what could be improved. In history, we thought about primary and secondary sources of information and we got to look at some real Victorian artefacts first hand. Just as historians do, we had to think about what we thought they were and what they were used for. There were some very interesting objects that got us a bit stumped! Year 6

As writers, the children have been learning about their favourite aspects of dinosaurs including the eras they existed in and even those periods of our planet's history that pre-dated them. With their newfound knowledge, the children began compiling their ideas into paragraphs with a view to creating a non-chronological report linked to their favourite topic. I have been so impressed by the level of detail, awareness of the reader and discussions around finding their non-fiction 'voice'. I cannot wait for them to share their finished work with each other next week.

As mathematicians, the children have been learning how to find fractions of amounts. They began decoding questions by using bar models to express their fractions. They then divided their whole number by the fraction's denominator to understand what a single segment would be worth and finally they learnt to multiply their segment by the value of the numerator to find the fraction of the amount. Well done everyone and thank you for persevering and using visual models to support your understanding.

During Design & Technology, the children have been designing and making their very own Christmas-themed wooden toys. The children needed to learn about the purpose of cams and cam shafts, utilise wood saws and bench hooks and gradually build up their skills through trial and error until they were happy with the finished result. The children have truly astounded me with how focused, disciplined and hardworking they have been throughout this project and we have had a record number of toys functioning as intended – well done, everyone.

What a fabulous week of learning this week! Next Monday is the Year 6 children's Christmas party so they are welcome to wear their Christmas jumpers once again for the occasion. Have a wonderful weekend. Mr. Young and Mrs. K


