We are so proud of how they have settled into their daily routines and have amazed us with how far they have come since September! This week, the children have all been super excited and have shown lots of enjoyment with all the Christmas activities we have set up to support their learning. The children have been very busy at our Christmas card station, which has been a firm favourite this week! They have improved their cutting skills by making 2D shape calendars and decorations. ### Year 1

What a fantastic end to the term! In English, we wrapped up our Supertato unit and wowed all the teachers with our brilliant retellings of the story. We worked hard to use the structure and language from the original text, and our efforts really shone through. After that, we had lots of fun creating our own alternative ending.

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There were so many imaginative and creative ideas! In maths, we impressed the adults again with our understanding of patterns using 2D and 3D shapes. We confidently named and recognised shapes, described their properties, and sorted them into groups. (It was wonderful to see how secure they are in their shape knowledge.) In science, we ended our topic in style with consolidating our learning in the form of a shadow puppet show! Combining English and science, we made puppets of Supertato characters and retold the story as a shadow performance. We amazed everyone by remembering and using all our key scientific vocabulary. This week was also the creation stage of our D&T project. We loved bringing our designs to life and practising our joining skills to make moving vehicles—Santa sleighs! They are now ready to be sent to the North Pole for Saint Nick to commission on Christmas Eve. Alongside this, we enjoyed making our Christmas calendars and celebrating at our Christmas party. On Friday, we had a wonderful time at our celebration assembly, where each class performed a Christmas song for everyone to enjoy. There has been so much festive fun this week, and we are all ready for a well-deserved winter break. What a wonderful half term it has been! ### Year 2

We were amazed with how much the children remembered about pirates when writing their reports and how much their writing has come along. It was great to see the children remembering to use other grammatical features such as conjunctions and adjectives in their writing too. In Maths, we have continued with shape and have been looking at 3D shapes and their properties particularly edges and vertices. Next term we will be looking at money, multiplication, and division. As geographers, the children have been looking at the different land uses in our local area of Cannon Park such as residential, housing, recreational and shopping. We used the tablets to help us explore the local area on Google maps. We have also had a fun morning making our Christmas cards and calendars - we hope that you like them. On Thursday afternoon, along with Year 1, we had our Christmas party which was a great success. The children loved playing the different party games in the hall and enjoyed eating the party food. Well done, Year 2, you should be so proud of yourselves for the first half term. We hope you enjoy the well-deserved rest during the holiday period.

On Monday, the children had their Christmas party and enjoyed playing a range of Blooket games on the Chromebooks to get them in the festive mood. Later, the children played games in the hall and enjoyed dancing and being active during Christmas Corners (a Cannon Park favourite). The children also played a game called coconut ball which involved organising themselves into a circle and attempting to knock a ball through their legs to score – we had lots of fun and Mr Young even managed to score a few points! The children placed an incredible 2nd and were 30 points clear of 3rd place. They have now been invited back to take part in the final in late January – well done, everyone!
