We are delighted to share that ten of our children in Year 5 and 6 will be working in conjunction with PC Matt Chater and West Midlands Police on the Junior PCSOs initiative. This is to give children experience of what life is like for police officers, an understanding of safety around our school and the legal system. We know that the children who have been selected are really looking forward to taking part in this scheme, we can't wait to see what exciting experiences they have!

Celebrating our Learning Reception

What a wonderful week of learning the children in Reception have had! As part of Design and Technology week, the children enjoyed designing and creating robots with junk modelling materials. The children were taught different skills on how to join their materials together and they really impressed us with how strong their models were! We then thought about our designs in more detail and added paint and various additions to improve our robots. In phonics we have learnt the digraphs 'long oo' and 'short oo' and this led onto some amazing drawing and writing about the story *Room on the Broom!* In maths, we have been learning about 3D shapes and many of us can now recognise a cube, sphere, cylinder, cone, pyramid and a cuboid! We even had fun printing with 3D shapes so we could see the 2D shapes within them! We have taken so much of our learning outside this week because of the beautiful weather. We continued to investigate bubbles, and we showed teamwork by creating a den together that we enjoyed reading in. We have been practicing our letter formation with chalk and even spent time outside with our Year 6 buddies. They showed us how to play basketball, how to throw and catch a ball, and even how to hula hoop!

At home this week we would like your child to continue their learning about 3D shapes. What 3D shapes can you spot at home and out and about?

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Year 1

What an exciting week! In English we have been practising our fundamental skills again. This week, we have focused on writing clear, simple sentences that make sense and joining our ideas together with the word 'and'. We have been making sure to use our capital letters, full stops and finger spaces correctly. In maths, we finished our topic on place value within 50 by estimating numbers on a number line and counting one more and one less of any number between 0 and 50. We sure went out with a bang! Any continued practice at home will be hugely beneficial. On Thursday, we started our new topic which is all about measurement. Our first lesson was comparing lengths and heights using mathematical language like longer, shorter, taller, shortest, tallest and longest. Next week, we will be exploring how to measure things using everyday objects before using centimetres. In RE, we explored angels again, this time from the viewpoint of people with Muslim worldviews. We read the story *My Special Angels: The Two Noble Scribes* by Razana Noor and learned that people with Muslim worldviews believe there are two angels that record the good and bad choices that people make. Then we discussed what good choices and bad choices are. This week has also been Design and Technology week. We have been designing and creating crockery, using air dry clay, to create crockery that our toys can eat their dinner on. We researched different style, shapes and patterns, before practising our rolling, pinching, smoothing and cutting skills to create them.

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Next Monday, when they are dry, we will paint them and then bring them home for you to see! Today, we are enjoying a trip the Coventry Transport Museum. More information and pictures to follow next week so watch this space! We hope you all have a wonderful weekend and we look forward to seeing you next week.

Year 2

It has been a very busy week in class this week. First of all, it has been D&T week in school. Our 'Big Question' for D&T was: What would you put in your fruit muffins? On Monday, we looked at where our food comes from and learnt that all food comes from plants or animals. We looked at how some food has to be farmed and can be grown at home by ourselves. It was lovely to hear from some of the children that they have had the chance to grow their own fruit and vegetables at home. On Wednesday, the children explored fruit further by naming and sorting them into five groups in the Eatwell Guide. We spoke about that everyone should eat at least five portions of fruit and vegetables every day. The children also had the chance to learn a song about keeping healthy by eating our fruit and vegetables. On Thursday, using the tablets the children explored where in the world different foods originate from. We spoke about the importance of climate found in a country and how this will determine the fruit that is grown in the country. We looked at fruit that is grown in the UK. Next week we will be tasting different fruits and deciding which one we would like to use in our fruit muffins. We will also be making our fruit muffins which the children are very excited about. In our English lessons, the children have enjoyed the book— 'John Patrick Norman McHennessy - The Boy who was Always Late!'. They have worked with a partner to draw a story map and used time adverbials to sequence the events in the story. On Tuesday, the children had the chance to create a number of different freeze frames based on key events from the book. During the rest of the week the children have been looking at using both time adverbials and conjunctions to help expand their sentences. In maths this week we have started our new topic of mass, capacity and temperature. To start the unit, we have started to look at mass. We focused on looking at the different scales which are found on measuring equipment, and we spoke about how the intervals may be counted in 1's, 2's, 10's and even 100. Also, we looked at comparing mass using the key words heavier and lighter and how this would look like on a balancing scale. We learned that the size of an object doesn't necessarily mean that it will be the heaviest object. It has been another great week of learning in Year 2, and we hope you all have a fantastic and restful weekend. We are looking forward to seeing you all next for another busy and final week before the Easter holidays. Miss Softic and Mrs Akthar



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Year 3

Wow! What an amazing, memorable week we have had in Year 3. The highlight must be our performance to the whole school and to our parents/carers on Wednesday. Didn't the children do a fantastic job? Even though there were some nerves, they truly excelled in remembering the dance routines and their lines for the play. It was a wonderful way to celebrate our learning of the Stone Age, and we were all so proud of them. Thank you again for all the support with practising the parts at home.

As it has been D&T week in school, we designed and made prehistoric pots, which was another great way to incorporate cross-curricular learning. We started the week finding out what prehistoric pottery looked like and what they might have been used for. Then, we drew designs for our own pots which included handles. We learned that the pots were decorated in particular designs using deer antlers, bones and even fingernails! Using clay, we made our pots and learned how to join two pieces of clay together using the 'slip, score and blend' technique. We used a range of different equipment to decorate our pot with patterns that would have been common in Stone Age pottery. As geographers, we have been exploring the polar regions and this week we learned how climate change is impacting the ice in Arctic and Antarctica. Having learned about what climate change is and what causes it, we made posters detailing what we can do to slow it down. A selection of the posters will be included in our whole school 'Earth Hour' display at the Cannon Park Shopping Centre next week. As mathematicians, we have learned to find fractions on a scale including number lines, count in fractions and find equivalent fractions. Next week, we will start our topic of mass and capacity. Well done, Year 3. You have all been superstars this week and thoroughly deserved the 'Stars of the Week' certificate today. Mrs Nagra and Miss Roberts



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



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Year 4

WOW! Didn't Year 3 and 4 do an amazing job on Wednesday night with their performance?! We hope you all enjoyed it. We're super proud of all of them. You may not be aware, but the children wrote the script and came up with the dance themselves too! Thank you for helping your child to learn their lines. It has also been Design & Technology Week this week as well. In Year 4, the children have been busy designing and making their own lamp shades. They have also investigated how to make an electrical circuit to make a light bulb light up and made a switch to turn it on and off. In our English lessons, at the end of the week, we started to explore the wordless, picture book – 'Journey'. Next week, the children will be writing their own journey stories. In maths, we have continued our learning on decimal numbers. The children have learnt how to divide one- and two-digit numbers by 10 and also learnt about hundredths as decimals and fractions. Next week, we'll be starting a new geography topic on settlements and also a new science topic on electricity. Next Tuesday and Thursday is parents' evening. Mrs Amphlett and I are looking forward to meeting with you to discuss your child's progress. We hope you all have a super, sunny weekend.

Year 5


Year 5 have had a super week. In English, we have been planning a newspaper report about HS2. This has involved gathering information from various sources, including news channels, and looking at the differing points of view concerning this issue. In maths, we have been finding the perimeter of rectilinear shapes and different polygons. We have also been finding the area of rectangles using the special formula of length multiplied by width. It has also been Design and Technology Week. Our task has been to design and make a make-up case for an ancient Egyptian to store their make-up. First of all, we looked at existing make-up bags to see what they were made from, how they fastened and what they measured. Next, we learnt the skills we would later need to make our make-up cases using a J cloth to practise on. This included sewing on a button, using running stitch and/or blanket stitch. We created our designs and made a paper pattern. After this, we cut out the felt for our make-up cases and then began sewing them and decorating them. The children have really enjoyed the activity and have impressed us with their sewing skills and their perseverance. On Thursday, we were lucky enough to have an online dance lesson with the Royal Ballet! This linked to our dance creations in PE last half term. The Royal Ballet interspersed the telling of the story of Alice in Wonderland with animation and real dancers performing, both in the studio and on stage. After each part of the story, it was our chance to perform! The children got the chance to explore lots of different motifs, actions and partner work to create a whole class dance. It looked amazing! 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Year 6

For Design and Technology week, the children made their very own spring rolls. Their plans were brought into motion last week where they researched ingredients, studied recipes and wrote out their methods. Following this, they conducted a taste test courtesy of Mrs. Kailey who cooked spring rolls for everyone to try. The children were pleasantly surprised by the taste, crunchiness and their contents. Then, on Tuesday, the children were given the opportunity to make their very own spring rolls according to recipes that they had chosen. The children chopped, diced and prepared their ingredients then met with Mrs Kailey in the kitchen to sauté their mixture. They then returned to the classroom with Mr. Young where he showed the children how to add their mixture to the delicate pastry and fold. The children then headed back into the kitchen to shallow fry their spring rolls. It was a wonderful morning made even better by the effort and teamwork the children demonstrated throughout. After a morning of hard work, the class were able to tuck into their spring rolls which I'm sure tasted even better having been made by themselves - well done, everyone!

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As part of their PSHE topic, the children were learning about energy drinks and the potential health risks associated with over consumption. They were surprised to find some energy drinks contained as much caffeine as 2 cups of coffee or 7 cups of tea and that they also contain over twice the recommended daily allowance of sugar! The children generally agreed that water was the best way to stay hydrated as it can be drunk at any time and that fruit juices were okay in moderation for their vitamins. The children even discussed the impact of marketing and how social media stars can influence what children drink and what parents spend their money on.

Within mathematics, the children have been refamiliarizing themselves with understanding area and perimeter. They were discovering that the area of shape contains two factors of the resultant area. They also solved problems involving misconceptions including area of rectilinear shapes and how the procedure differs from a more come rectangular shape.

What a brilliant week of learning everyone. Well done, once again for your hard work especially within your D & T project and thank you to parents for your contributions. Have a wonderful weekend! Mr. Young and Mrs. Kailey




