Pencil Cases and Toys

Just as a reminder, children do not need to bring in toys, including squishy toys, to school. Children also do not need to bring in pencil cases – everything they need for their learning is provided in school. A small number of children do enjoy drawing at lunchtime and, for this purpose, a small pencil case would be appropriate, but they are not needed during lesson time. We find this avoids unnecessary fallings out.

Junior PCSOs

Our Junior PCSOs had an exciting hands-on learning experience as they investigated a mock crime scene to find out how the police collect clues and evidence. Using their observation skills, they explored how fingerprints, footprints and careful note-taking can help solve crimes. The activity helped pupils understand the importance of teamwork, attention to detail and problem-solving, while learning how police officers work hard to keep our community safe.

Celebrating our Learning Reception

What a wonderful week the children have had in Reception, especially outdoors in the beautiful weather! This week, we read the story *Here We Are* by Oliver Jeffers and learnt lots about planet Earth. We looked at globes and talked about the differences between the land and the sea. We enjoyed finding out about all the different creatures that live in the ocean and made some fantastic jelly fish! We also had fun getting messy with a very creative around the world activity. We used flour to create snow in colder countries and even created a bright blue foam to represent the ocean! We found out about different countries and some of the children enjoyed sharing their own experiences of visiting them. In phonics we have learnt the sounds 'ure' and 'air' and have continued to practise writing simple sentences with finger spaces and fill stops. In maths, we have been counting and representing numbers to 20 as well as improving our addition skills with numbers to 10. We showed teamwork in many games we have played to support our understanding. We especially enjoyed using our fine motor skills to count and thread beads onto pipe cleaners!

Next week, we will be reading the story *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* and our learning will be based around this book. We will even have some real caterpillars in the classroom that we will observe over the next two weeks completing their life cycle and hopefully turning into beautiful butterflies!

At home, please continue to support your child with writing simple sentences independently. Encourage them to use the sounds they have learnt in school.

Year 1

This week in Year 1, we have had a wonderful time learning across the curriculum. In English, we began a new unit inspired by *How to Look After Your Dinosaur*, discovering that the text is full of instructions. We have been breaking instructional writing into clear steps and practising key skills so that next week we can create our own instruction booklets about how to care for a dinosaur. We have focused on spotting and using time adverbials, imperative verbs and adverbs in sentences. In maths, we explored multiplication as repeated addition by adding equal groups, before moving on to creating arrays and finding doubles of numbers up to 20. Any support at home with using the language 'groups of' and 'lots of' (for example, 3 equal groups of 2 = 2 + 2 + 2 = 6) would greatly support future learning. In science, we revisited what plants need to survive and then explored how birds depend on plants for food and shelter. We discussed bird habitats around our school and how the seasons affect food supply, before creating apple and seed bird feeders to attract more birds into our grounds. In history, we compared Victorian bicycles with modern ones, noticing similarities such as having two wheels, and differences including design, materials and the use of brakes. In RE, we learned about why harmony is important within Muslim worldviews and explored the concept of *Ummah*—the belief that all Muslims belong to one caring global community. We linked this to our own school community and discussed how people support one another, revisiting the pillar of Zakat and learning about ways Muslims help others through giving food, clothing, housing and providing free educational and sports opportunities. What a lovely and busy week it has been! In Book Talk, it's more dinosaurs! We have started our learning on a non-fiction book where we are learning even more about them and having so much fun developing our oracy in doing it. We hope you all have a wonderful, long bank holiday weekend and we look forward to seeing you on Tuesday! Miss Brett and Miss Delargy

Year 2

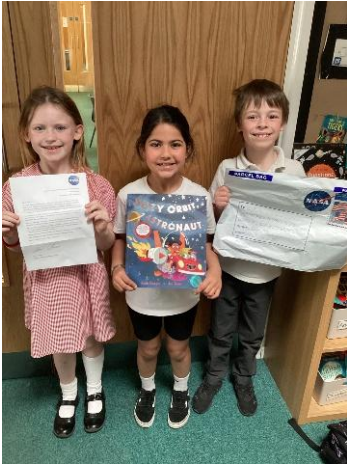
We have had another fabulous week of learning in Year 2. In English this week, the children have been writing their own adventure story based on *The way back home*. It was great to see the children remembering to use all the different skills that they have been taught during our phase two lessons. In their writing, they have included: adverbs to start a sentence; conjunctions to extend their sentences; adjectives to add more descriptive details; and time adverbials to sequence their stories. Well done, Year 2 – Mrs Akthar and I thoroughly enjoyed reading all of your stories and it is amazing to see how much all of your writing has developed through the year. On Thursday, we received a parcel from NASA. The children couldn't wait to open it and find out what had been sent. Inside, we discovered a letter asking the children to write a persuasive letter explaining why they should become an astronaut on their team. The children are very excited and are really looking forward to writing their letters. We looked at the features of a letter and identified them together, including the opening statement, conjunction to begin, present tense and closing statement. The children enjoyed spotting these features and understanding how they help to organise a letter clearly. In our maths lessons this week, the class have continued their learning on fractions. This week the children have been focusing on recognising and finding quarters, thirds and wholes. We have been using the bar model to support us with finding the different fractions of amounts. Next week, we will be moving on to non-unit fractions (three quarters) and learning that two quarters and a half are equivalent. As scientists this week, we have been learning about lifecycles. We looked at how butterflies and frogs grow and change as they get older. We learned that both animals start as eggs, but they grow in different ways. We talked about how all living things grow and change over time. In PE with Miss Bullock, we have been practising our target skills by using a ball to strike down the pin. We have been aiming carefully and taking turns to improve our accuracy. We had great fun while learning and enjoyed cheering each other on! As geographers, we have been looking at what happens when it doesn't rain. We learnt the meaning of the word 'drought'. This is a dry period when there is a lot less water than usual and happens because of changes in the winds that bring the rain or ocean currents, which affect the temperature and moisture of the air. We looked at the effect this has on plants, animals and land. In computing, we looked at how people can be described by different attributes, such as hair colour or eye colour. We had the chance to practise using these attributes to describe pictures of people and others in the class through the game of *guess who*. Then we collected data to organise people by these attributes and create a pictogram to show their results. Finally, we looked at their pictograms to find out information and share what they have discovered. Well done for another fabulous week of learning. Year 3

And just like that, another week of exciting learning has flown by in Year 3. During our English lessons, we were introduced to the mysteries of Harris Burdick's drawings. We were left fascinated by them and wondered what stories could go with each. We enjoyed using his drawings as inspiration for short stories and focused on a key skill each day, namely using fronted adverbials, subordinating conjunctions and prepositions. As mathematicians, this week, we have learned how to add and subtract fractions (with same denominators), and we have found unit fractions and non-unit fractions of a set of objects. Next week, we will commence our new topic on *money*. Any support at home with recognising different coins and notes (even counting money) will be greatly appreciated.

During our geography lesson, we discovered that Cairo (Egypt's capital) and Coventry have many similarities and differences. Using Google Maps, we investigated physical and human geography features of the two cities. As scientists, we discovered fun facts about the moon. Surprisingly, we found out that the moon is not a light source and only appears to shine because the sun's light is reflected onto Earth. During PE, we continued to learn the skills needed in tennis including forehand and backhand strokes. Year 4

On Monday, we started a new writing unit by watching a short film – 'The Saga of Biorn'. Biorn is an aging Viking who wants to die valiantly so that he can go to Valhalla but events go against him! The children have learnt to use the column method to add and subtract amounts of money, find change and solve problems involving money. Next week, we will be starting a new maths unit on time. To help at home, please can you support your child to revise telling the time. By the end of Year 3, children are expected to be able to tell the time to the nearest minute. As geographers, the children found out what a mega-city is and used an atlas to locate different mega-cities around the world. They also considered what cities of the future may be like and learnt about 'The Line' in Saudi Arabia. In RE, they have learnt about the 5Ks of the Sikh religion and in computing, they have learnt to animate their name. In PSHE, the children discussed and considered how our choices affect the world. In a couple of weeks, we have art week. Year 4 will be creating their own tie-dye t-shirts for art week. To support with this, please can you send your child into school with a **plain white t-shirt on Monday 11th May**. Well done, Year 4 – have a super bank holiday weekend! Year 5

What a sunny week it's been! We've had lots of great learning going on in Year 5. Having learnt about the transatlantic slave trade last week, we listened to Kwame Alexander reading his book *Unspoken*, which talks about enslaved people being taken from Africa and made to work in America. As a whole class, we thought about the different emotions that the enslaved people would feel and acted out the story. We all enjoyed sharing our drama work with the Year 6 children and staff, along with Mr Ray and Mr Kelley. On Thursday, we used pictures from the story to write sentences beginning with emotion words. In maths, we have also been calculating angles around a point, on a straight line and inside shapes. We took our learning outside and had to decide whether different shapes were regular or irregular. In PE, we have been practising different individual and partner balances, as well as improving our hockey skills outside. In science, we have been comparing the lifecycles of different creatures. This included frogs, butterflies and hens. We also have some new members of Year 5! These are caterpillars, which are getting bigger by the day and also some stick insect eggs. Nothing has happened yet with the stick insect eggs but we are watching them carefully! In computing, we have started creating and filming our own videos. In geography this week, we found out about the layers of a temperate forest. As we are lucky enough to have an abundance of vegetation on our school field, we went outside to sketch the different layers. Next, we began finding out about the conditions, plants and animals that make up a tropical rainforest. To end the week, we had another enjoyable session with the Sky Blues in the Community, where we learnt about keeping ourselves both healthy and fit. We hope you enjoy the Bank Holiday weekend. Year 6

As writers, the children have been putting the finishing touches to their short narratives inspired by *The Hobbit*. I have been so impressed by what I have read and was pleased to see a range of features that have added atmosphere to their work. Furthermore, the children's take on Mirkwood forest varied dramatically which meant for enjoyable and very different stories from everyone.

As mathematicians, the children have been refamiliarising themselves with four-quadrant grids. They have been solving a range of problems by mapping out coordinates to make a range of shapes as well as learning to translate vertices across both the y and x axis. Additionally, I have been so impressed by the effect the class has shown in preparation for their SATs. They have been completing a range of arithmetic problems each day and have used their oracy skills to support each other to help fill gaps in their knowledge – it's been a great way to start our day in Year 6!

Within science, the children carried out investigations to find out how light travelled. We used mirrors and torches to identify that light that bounced off mirrors if placed on a 45° angle. The children then discovered that light would be redirected 90°. The class used this information to solve a range of problems where light needed to travel and pass obstacles in order for it to reach its destination. What a great investigation, everyone.

Within R.E, we were exploring some of life's big questions such as 'Are we alone in the universe?' and 'Could humanity ever achieve peace and equality?' I was so impressed by how well the children articulated their views, debated their opinions and generally learnt from each other. It was a fantastic investigative lesson where we learnt to appreciate that some questions are far too big to be conclusively answered.
