Happy birthday to Sir David Attenborough, who is 100 today! To mark this occasion, Mrs Nagra has organised a nature activity. ### Junior PCSOs

Our Junior PCSO session was both engaging and thought-provoking, as pupils took part in a mock murder trial to learn how the justice system works. The children explored the different roles within a courtroom, including the judge, lawyers and jurors, and discussed how evidence is considered before decisions are made. They worked hard to listen, debate and reason carefully, ultimately ending with a hung jury and no verdict reached – a powerful reminder that trials are not always straightforward. The session encouraged critical thinking, teamwork and a deeper understanding of how laws help keep people safe.



### Celebrating our Learning Reception

Another exciting week of learning in Reception this week! As a class, we read the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and practised re-telling the story with some exciting props that we made to support our learning. We showed teamwork by creating a huge caterpillar together and talked about what we would eat if we were a caterpillar! We really enjoyed finding out how a tiny caterpillar turns into a beautiful butterfly! Did you know that once the caterpillar breaks out of its egg, it's so hungry that it eats the egg to become stronger? The children were so excited to be here when our real caterpillars arrived on Tuesday. We are looking forward to observing them over the next couple of weeks! In phonics we have learnt the sounds 'ure' and 'er' and have continued to practise writing simple sentences with finger spaces and full stops. In maths, we have been counting and representing numbers to 20 and showed teamwork in many games we have played to support our understanding. We have also been looking at rotating 2D shapes and had fun creating so many different pictures.

Next week is our whole school art week and we will be looking at the famous *Sunflower* painting by Vincent Van Gogh.

Please continue to support your child at home with their reading. There are lots of games on Bug Club you can use to support this too.

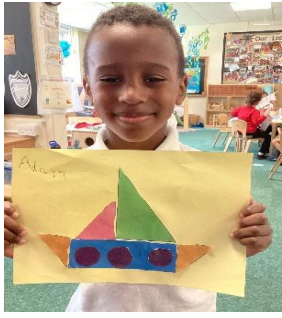

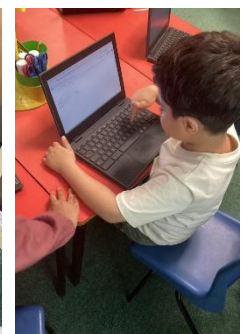

### Year 1

What a lovely week we have had in Year 1! In English, we began the week by learning how to use the conjunction *'because'* to explain our ideas clearly. We used this to describe why each dinosaur care instruction is important. We then created our own dinosaur care instruction booklets, carefully including all the steps we have learned in our writing and they look absolutely fantastic!

In maths, we wrapped up our multiplication and division topic by learning how to divide whole numbers into equal groups. Any additional support at home to reinforce this concept would be hugely beneficial when we revisit it in the summer term. For example, understanding that 15 split into 3 equal groups equals 5. In RE, we explored the question: *How do those with Muslim worldviews often demonstrate their beliefs?* We discussed the meaning of the word *'embodiment'* and explored how some Muslims express their beliefs through what they wear, eat (or choose not to eat), and do. We learned that some Muslims may wear special clothing such as a hijab or abaya, avoid eating pork, pray five times a day, visit a mosque, and give to charity. In computing, we are enjoying a new topic on Digital Writing. This week, we have been learning how to enter text using a word processor. We have practised using letter, number, and space keys, as well as the backspace key to edit our work. We are having so much fun learning this new way of writing, it's very different from our usual pencil and paper in English! This Friday also marked Sir David Attenborough's 100th birthday! We were very excited to celebrate with an online assembly, where we learned about his life, work, and incredible legacy. He is truly inspiring. We felt very happy and grateful to have had the opportunity to take part in such a special celebration. We have really enjoyed this short but fun-packed week. 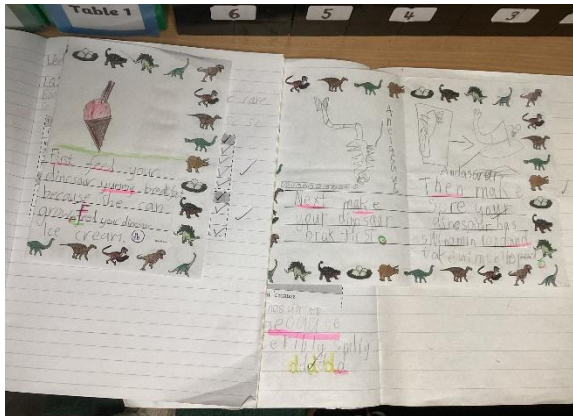

### Year 2

We have had an amazing and hardworking week in Year 2. During this week in English, we have continued with the theme of space and our book 'Suzy Orbit Astronaut'. We have looked at writing our own present tense and conjunctions sentences based on the book. On Thursday, the children had the opportunity to plan their letter to NASA thinking about why they would make a good astronaut. Miss Bullock and I are looking forward to reading the children's persuasive letters next week. In our maths lesson this week, we have been continuing with the topic of fractions. The children have learnt about how two quarters and a half are equivalent whilst finding and recognising three quarters in both numbers and shapes. We spoke about how in order to find three quarters we need to find one quarter first. We have continued to use the bar model to support us with finding fractions of different amounts. In our science lesson, we have concluded our topic of sporting superstars by learning about the importance of a balanced diet. We learnt about the different food groups and how to keep healthy. We used this knowledge to create a healthy breakfast, lunch and dinner and ensured that each meal was a balanced meal including all the different food groups. As geographers this week, we have been exploring the learning question: *How do we conserve water?*. We explored ways in which we can save water such as turning off the tap when brushing our teeth and taking a shower rather than a bath. The children came up with a number of great solutions on how they can save water themselves both at home and at school.

Well done, Year 2, for another fabulous week of learning. We hope you all enjoy your weekend.

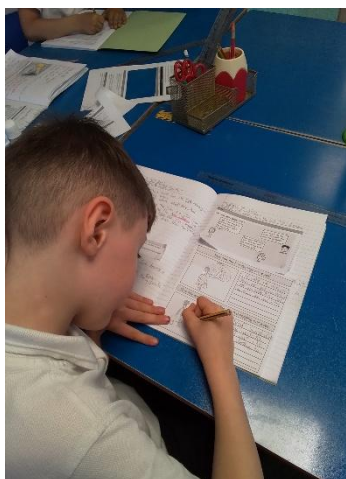

### Year 3

It has been another fabulous week of learning in Year 3. This week, we were excited to start our new topic of *money* in our maths lessons. We consolidated our prior learning of recognising coins and notes, counting pounds and pence, and making amounts. We explored how to use different coins to make the same amount, converted pounds and pence, and learned how to add and subtract amounts. If you could continue to support your child at home with using different coins and notes, it will be greatly appreciated. It is such an important life skill for children to recognise money values, count money, and solve real-life money problems. In English, after hearing the Wolf's side of the story from the True Story of the Three Little Pigs, we are convinced that the wolf was framed for committing those crimes against the pigs. During the week, we have been learning about the features of a persuasive text, and we are looking forward to writing letters to the Pig Judge next week. In our comprehension lessons, we are enjoying reading Planet Omar and using the VIPERS skills to help us understand the text.

As scientists, we learned how the light from our largest and most powerful light source – the Sun – can be dangerous. We thought of ways we can protect our eyes and skin from its harmful UV rays. In our learning of why the River Nile is so important, we discovered how a river flows from its source to its mouth, where it joins the sea or lake. Today, we have loved celebrating Sir David Attenborough's 100th birthday with a live assembly where we learned about his life and legacy. What a great inspiration he is to us all! ### Year 4

This week the children have dazzled us with their fantastic writing. They have been writing letters of persuasion to Odin as to whether or not Biorn the Viking should be allowed into Valhalla. In their letters, they included: opening and closing statements; detailed paragraphs to explain their reasons; adverbials of cohesion; and relative clauses. In our reading lessons, the children have continued to enjoy the book, Varjak Paw. A big thank you to everyone who has bought their child a copy of Varjak Paw. However, we don't have quite enough school copies for the remaining children to have a copy each so, if possible, if you haven't done so already, please could you buy your child a copy. In maths, we have started a new topic on *time*. Throughout the week, we have been revising telling the time which is a really tricky skill for the children to master. Like last week, we would be grateful if you could continue to support your child with mastering this at home. Next week, we will be learning about the different units of time (i.e. 60 seconds in a minute, 24 hours in a day, etc.), converting between analogue and digital time (i.e. quarter to 4 is the same as 3:45), and learning about the 24-hour clock. As geographers, the children have enjoyed looking at Ordnance Survey maps, learning about scale, grid references and mapping symbols. In their RE lesson, the children have learnt what a Gurdwara is and in PSHE, they have considered the importance of buying Fairtrade products. Next week, we have art week. Year 4 will be creating their own tie-dye t-shirts for art week.

### Year 5

Despite a shorter week than usual, Year 5 have still done lots of learning. This week, Year 5 have been busy writing letters, imagining they are an enslaved person writing to their family after their capture. The children have really impressed us with their empathy and use of emotional vocabulary in their writing. Everyone wrote up their letter on some aged paper to add to the authenticity. In maths, we explored the properties of 3D shapes and then began a new topic called Position and Direction, where we read and plotted coordinates and solved problems involving coordinates.

Year 5 have been thoroughly enjoying observing their class caterpillars as part of their science learning about life cycles and metamorphosis. The children have carefully watched the caterpillars grow and learned that, just as in nature, not every transformation goes to plan. Over the weekend, sadly, Leicester did not survive the change into the pupa stage, but this provided a valuable opportunity to discuss resilience and the realities of the natural world. We are remaining hopeful that Wednesday will successfully complete the pupa stage as she failed to attach to the hatching station, and the children are eagerly checking each day to see what happens next to Frank, Bobby, and Sakamoto who did! We are also still patiently waiting for our stick insect eggs to hatch, which could happen at any time from now until the end of term!

In our science lesson, we compared the lifecycles of different mammals and thought about whether they are the same. These included humans, kangaroos and the platypus. Although they are all mammals, they vary in terms of how and where they develop during their lifecycle. In RE, we have been looking at how the Genesis creation story has been depicted in art form. We looked at three pieces of creation art and considered which aspect of the story they could be representing. In computing, we have been practising filming skills ready to make our own short films. We learnt the techniques of zooming in, a close up and a long shot. As geographers, we have continued to research the layers of the rainforest and how they provide different kinds of habitats and sources of food for the plants and animals of the Amazon Rainforest. We collated our information in the form of a flap book, which included information and drawings of the layers and creatures. On Friday, we had our fourth session with Sky Blues in the Community, focusing on healthy lifestyles. Next week is Art Week. The children will need to bring in an old shirt or t shirt to cover their clothes. We hope you all have a lovely weekend. Mrs Aston, Mrs Reihill and Mrs Cleveland

### Year 6

We are incredibly proud of how hard the children have been working in preparation for their upcoming SATs. They have shown real commitment during revision sessions this week, particularly in reading, where they have practised comprehension, vocabulary, and retrieval skills with confidence and focus. Additionally, the children have been exploring the presentation of such text types including the placement of information in illustrations which are just as important to decode as main bodies of text.

The class have also been practicing spellings daily including a range of spellings and rules that were spelt incorrectly by the large majority of the country last year. We have made a list of predicted spellings based on rules that children commonly get wrong and of words that have not featured in the SATs paper in recent years.

In maths, the children have been revising key areas such as fractions, decimals, and percentages, as well as consolidating their understanding of important concepts including prime numbers, squared numbers, and cubed numbers. We've used a range of resources from LBQ maths modules, bespoke made booklets and past paper materials to help prepare us for next week in the best way possible.

On Wednesday afternoon, the class once again represented themselves and the school wonderfully as they played alongside their reception buddies on the field. It was lovely to see them showing their school values and being so kind and patient with the younger children. Miss Swain was very impressed by how caring they were.

Their positive attitudes, resilience, and determination have been evident throughout, and this thorough preparation has built both their skills and their confidence. Thank you for your continued support at home. We hope you have a restful weekend and feel prepared and ready to ace those exams next week.
