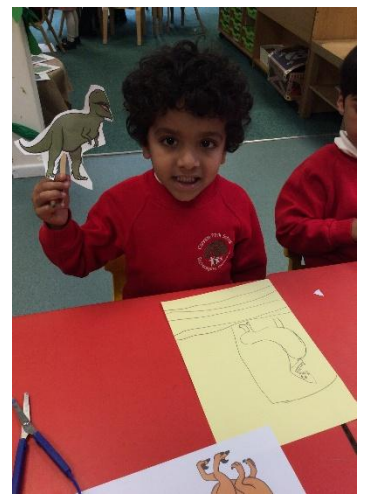
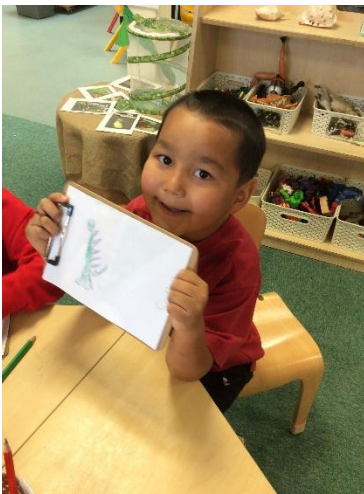
### Celebrating our Learning

#### Reception

Wow! Another amazing week of learning in Reception! This week, the children have been finding out about dinosaurs and have engaged in lots of fun and exciting activities to support their learning. We went outside on a dinosaur hunt and used our phonics knowledge to try and read the type of dinosaurs we found. We used our creative skills to make 2D shape dinosaurs and different dinosaur masks and had fun moving around the classroom like our favourite dinosaurs would have. The children had lots of questions during our learning, and they learnt so many fun facts. Did you know that a T-Rex's tooth would have been the same size as a banana? In writing, we have continued to practice our letter formation and have written simple sentences by making sure we use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. It's brilliant to see the children confidently using their phonics knowledge in their writing too! In maths, we have begun learning about sharing equally and we found out that not all numbers can be shared equally between different groups. We are becoming more confident in explaining our reasoning with mathematical problems, especially using the sentence starter "I know because..." We played games in pairs to support our understanding too! Please continue to read with you child over the half term and have fun playing the phonics games on Bug Club. At this point in Reception, your child should be able to blend sounds to read words, so please support you child with this.

Well done, Reception! Have a fantastic half term and we will see you all on Tuesday 2nd June.

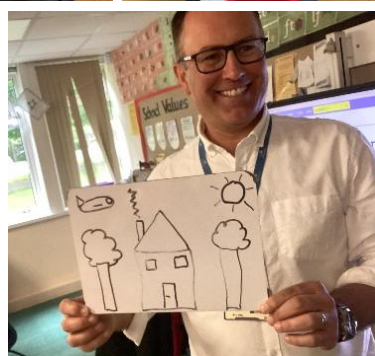

### Year 1

What a lovely last week we have had, and the sunshine made an appearance in the end to help mark it! This week in English, we have been busy drafting and writing our own *emotion poems*. We carefully followed our learning steps to make sure we included repetition, capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and a conjunction in our writing. We then added illustrations to bring our poems to life. They look fantastic, and we are very proud of them! In maths, we have been learning to recognise and find a quarter of different objects, shapes and quantities. Year 1 have truly blown us away with how well they can do this! Any extra practice at home will really help the children to secure and retain this important knowledge. Next term, we will be exploring time, and understanding halves and quarters will support the children when learning to tell the time. During our history lesson, we recapped everything we have learned about bikes through history. We then used this knowledge to plot different types of bicycles on a timeline, helping us to understand how bikes have changed over time. In science, we focused on identifying and describing the different parts of a plant and learning about the important job each part has. We created our own plant pictures, labelled them accurately, and wrote some amazing facts to show our understanding. In RE, we completed our unit on Muslim worldviews by exploring the question: *Are all Muslims living life in the same way?* Many of us initially thought the answer was yes, but we learned that not all Muslims practise their faith in the same way. For example, some may not pray five times a day, some may not fast if they are too young or unwell, and some may choose to wear special clothing, like a hijab, only on certain occasions. As always, we enjoyed learning from the Muslim experts in the room, we really value the knowledge shared. In computing, we enjoyed learning how to edit and format text. We practised highlighting words and changing them into bold, italics, and underline, as well as adjusting the font style and size. We also had a fantastic session with Mr Kelley on Wednesday. We listened very carefully to instructions in a fun drawing activity. Although everyone followed the same directions, the final picture wasn't revealed until the end, which made it even more exciting! They all looked just like what Mr Kelley was drawing so it shows that we did a good job with our listening skills! And last, but certainly not least, we thoroughly enjoyed the Summer Fayre! We absolutely loved seeing all the stalls and having a go and some of the games. We particularly enjoyed eating lots of the treats! It was a wonderful afternoon full of fun and laughter; a perfect way to end this half term. Well done, Year 1, for another brilliant half term of learning! ### Year 2

We can't believe how quickly this half term has flown by! In our English lesson, we have continued looking at the story of 'Lost and Found'. During the start of the week, the children have learnt how to use adverbs within a sentence and planned their own quest story in the style of the book. On Wednesday and Thursday, the children used their ideas from the plan to write their own story. It was lovely to read all the children's stories and find out where their quest stories took their characters on an adventure. It was great to see the children's imagination come to life through their writing. Miss Bullock and I were so impressed with the children's writing, and it was brilliant to see how they had remembered to use the skills they had been taught from our phase two lesson such as conjunctions, adverbs, adjectives and time adverbials. In maths this week, we have been continuing with our topic of time we have looked at quarter past, quarter to and five minutes past and five minutes to whilst using the clocks to support our learning. It has been wonderful to see the children's confidence increase with each lesson and becoming more confident with telling the time. As scientists this week, we have started to explore a new big question 'How do plants grow'. We explored what is needed for a plant to grow well. We found that a plant needs water, sunlight, air and temperature and they are all as important as each other for the plant. In geography, we have started to explore a new big question 'Where would you prefer to live in either Kenya or the UK'. The children looked at where Kenya is in the world and located the country on map using the atlas. They learnt that the capital city of Kenya is Nairobi. The children had the chance to use the atlases to support them with answering some geographical question based on the country. In RE, we started to our explored our new big question 'Why has the Coventry Blitz shaped Christian worldviews locally and globally?'. We looked at Coventry's medieval cathedral and learnt that this was destroyed during the Coventry Blitz in November 1940. We spoke about how Coventry's Cathedral is an important place for many people locally from a range of worldviews and has significance for some people from outside of this local area and in the wider world. Finally, the children had the opportunity to finish off the clay pots which we created last week during Art week. The children painted them in the style of Magdalene Odundo. It was fantastic to see the children showing great enjoyment through the task and seeing how their pots ended up when they had finished. We hope you all enjoy the half term break, it's certainly well deserved! We look forward to seeing you back on Tuesday 2nd June. Miss Softic and Miss Bullock



### Year 3

And just like that, we have come to the end of another great half-term. We have had such a wonderful week of learning. As writers, we have been impressing Miss Roberts with our use of prepositional phrases, setting descriptions and inverted commas. On Thursday, we wrote our own short stories, which were based on suspense had us all gripped to see what would happen next. During our maths lessons, we have been working extremely hard on telling the time using analogue and digital clocks. We have learned how to tell the time to the minute, how to use a.m. and p.m., and the number of days in a week, and days and months in a year. Throughout the day, we have been stopping regularly to read the time using our classroom clock. Any extra practise with telling the time at home will be greatly appreciated (for example, a quick 'What is the time now?' on an analogue or digital clock, will get the children practising such an important everyday skill).

During our computing lesson, we started our new topic on desktop publishing and investigated the advantages and disadvantages of 'images and 'text'. We have been enjoying our music lessons with Miss Brett, and this week, we improvised with pitch, tempo and dynamics. By performing as part of a group, we were able to put the fundamental elements of music together. As tennis pros, we put all our skills of the sport into action and played a series of matches. As scientists, we investigated the difference between translucent, transparent and opaque objects and went on a scavenger hunt to classify items in our classroom. Then, to finish off our learning we created a translucent stained-glass window. On Thursday, we celebrated Outdoor Classroom Day with a times tables relay. ### Year 4

At the end of last week, Year 4 were really excited to find out how their tie-dye t-shirts had turned out and they weren't disappointed. They were absolutely fantastic! In our English lessons, the children have really impressed us with their fantastic non-chronological reports about 'The Legend of Troy'. They have set their work out imaginatively over a double-page spread to look like the page of a non-fiction book. They have included: paragraphs, headings and sub-headings, pictures and captions, opening paragraphs, and adverbs of cohesion. Great writing Year 4! In our maths lessons this week, the children have been learning about statistics. They have used bar charts and line graphs to answer questions such as: what is the difference between? How many altogether? What is the total?

After half-term, we will be revising some of our times-tables in readiness for the Multiplication Tables Check. Over the half-term break, please encourage your child to keep practising their times-tables on TTRockstars. As historians, we have started a new topic on the Vikings. In their first lesson on this topic, the class learnt where the Vikings came from and some key events of the Viking period. As geographers, the children made their own maps of our school grounds, including symbols, a scale and a key. Then, they tested these out with their learning partners by using grid references to make a treasure trail of clues to find out what was in each grid reference. In RE, the children considered whether Muslims pray five times a day and in computing, they learnt how to modify a game. Well done, Year 4 - another excellent week. ### Year 5

Year 5 have had a busy end to the half term. In English, we have been practising different grammar skills, including apostrophes for contractions and possession and adverbs. In maths, we began a unit about decimals. We have been adding and subtracting decimals within one and finding ways to make one. We also added and subtracted across the one and learnt to add same place decimals. On Tuesday, we set off with Year 6 and walked to Warwick University, to take part in an event called *Singing After SATs*. We had all learnt a song called *Brighter Day Tomorrow*. It was lovely singing along with other schools and everyone had a great time. In geography, we found out about the people of the rainforest. We took the learning outside of the classroom and went to the hall, where pieces of information about different tribes had been hidden. We had to find a piece each and look on the back to see which tribe we belonged to. Next, we had to find the fellow members of our tribe and read through the information we had gathered to find out all about how our tribe live in the Amazon Rainforest. Each group reported what they had learnt back to the class.. This week, we also got chance to complete our batik textile work from Art Week. Having flaked off the flour to reveal the 'resist' parts of our designs, we then embellished them by sewing into them, adding fabrics and sequins to enhance our designs. The children have done such a good job with this activity, and they all look absolutely super! This week, we had our last session with *Sky Blues in the Community*. The children have really enjoyed this experience and have learnt lots about keeping fit and healthy. Year 5 have worked hard this half term, and we are so proud of them all. It was really nice to end the half term with our Spring Fair. We all had a lovely afternoon. We hope you have a lovely holiday. It looks like the weather is going to be kind to us! The children then modified their printing blocks according to their preferences in preparation for printing with ink. The children are working really hard on their designs and I look forward to sharing their final results once after we return from the half-term break.

As part of their post sats project work, the children have been combining their maths skills with computing and have been planning a holiday for Mr. Young on the chromebooks. The children have been given a set of criteria including budget, location preferences and duration of the holiday and they have been tasked with organising their finances using spreadsheet software. They have also been producing presentation slides so that they can showcase their findings once their projects are complete. It's been wonderful to see the children working so well together and I look forward to seeing where I will be flying off to this summer! Finally, the long-awaited decision on our leaver's play was finally laid to rest this week and the children have now been given their roles. We have completed our first read through and are excited to begin our rehearsals when we return. Any support with props or costumes will be well received so feel free to encourage your child to read through their part over the break if they have a spare half an hour.
