Class Teachers

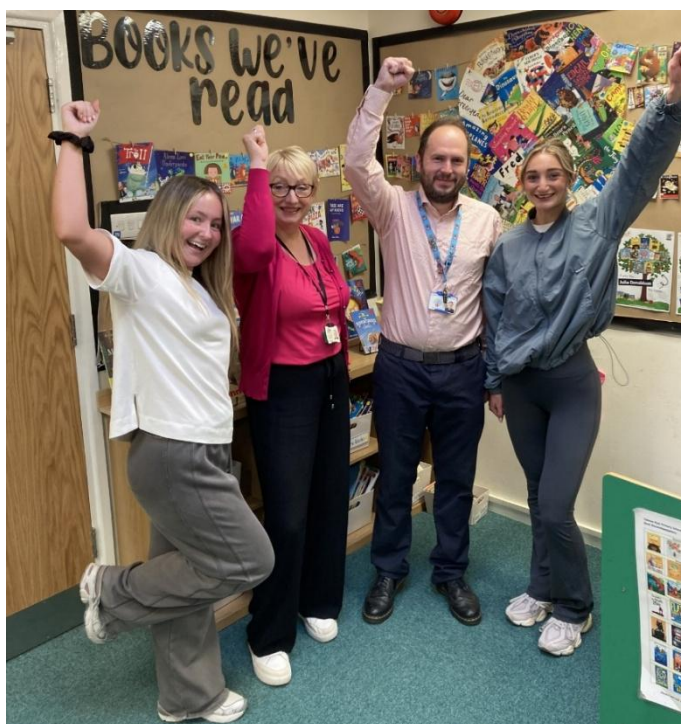

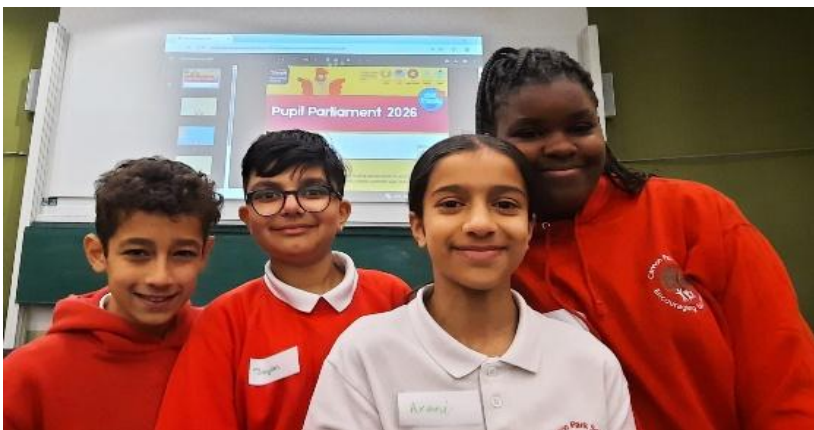

Celebrating our Learning Reception

The children in Reception have really impressed us this week! It has been so lovely to hear the children use our word of the week *marvellous* in their conversations with each other. 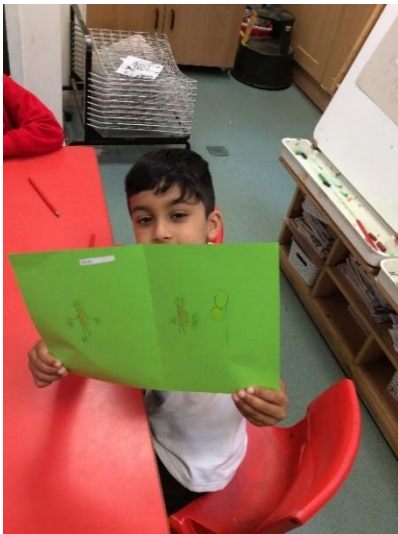
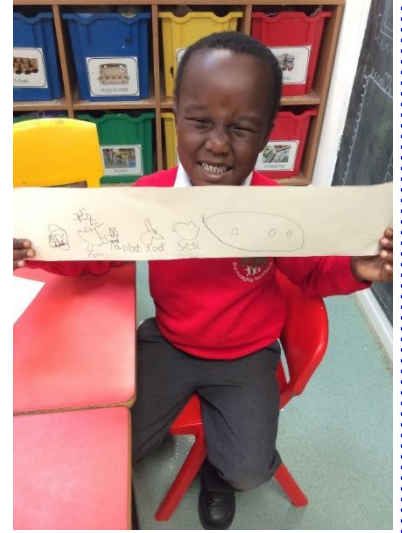
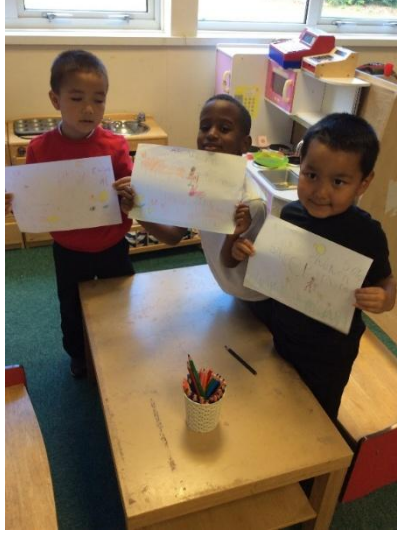

Year 1

We have had a lovely, busy week in Year 1. In English, we planned our descriptive stories about a trip to the World Cup in Mexico by creating story maps. We started by sequencing the key events before adding in some exciting descriptive details. In maths we began a new topic on Place Value to 100. So far, we have been counting in tens to 100 and revisiting our understanding of tens and ones to count between 50 and 100, building on our previous learning. In science, we completed our topic on plants by naming and comparing common fruit and vegetable plants. We spotted similarities such as colour and shape, as well as differences, including which part of the plant they come from (for example, broccoli is the flower, an apple is the fruit, and a carrot is the root). Next week, we are excited to begin our new topic on seasons. In geography, we explored why people visit the seaside, created mind maps of our ideas, and wrote postcards imagining we had visited, sharing all the fun activities we might enjoy. Lots of us have been to the seaside before and all of us said we would love to go in the summer! In RE, we explored what ceremonies are important within our community. We recapped what community means and learned that ceremonies are special events that people celebrate together.

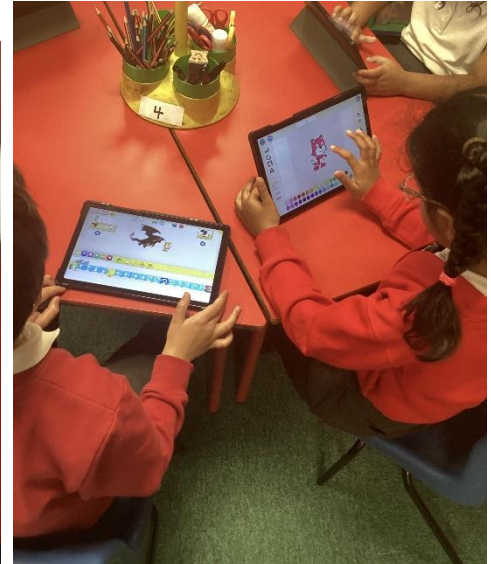
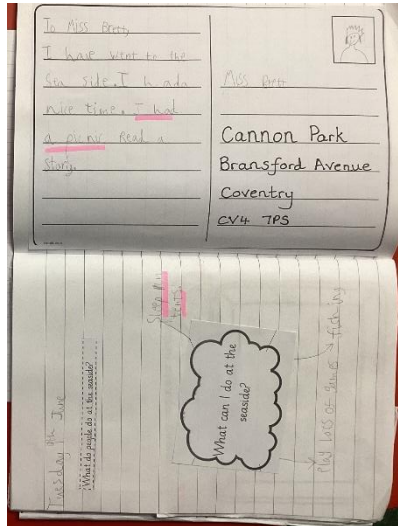

We explored some examples and who they are for and shared ones that are meaningful in our own worldview. This week has also been a very important week in Year 1 because it's been the National Phonics Screening Week and Year 1 have done tremendously well! They have used all their school values and worked so hard to apply their phonics skills and knowledge. They have truly impressed us all and should be very proud of themselves. Year 2

It has been another hardworking week in Year 2 with lots of fantastic learning. In English, we have been focusing on using sound cause words as well as planning our recount based on the story from the viewpoint of Rose or Jack. During the second half of the week, the children had the opportunity to write their recounts. It was lovely to read and see the children's writing and see how much their writing has developed over the course of the year. They have all worked hard to include many of the grammatical features that have been taught over the year and have thought about how to further develop their writing. In maths this week, we have started our new topic of Statistics. The children have been looking at tally charts and block diagrams. It has been great to see the children's confidence and enjoyment grow with their learning and see how much they have remembered within their long-term memory from our computing topic on pictograms. Next week we will be looking at drawing and interpreting pictograms where the symbol may represent either 1,2,5 or 10 objects depending upon its key. As scientists this week, we have looked at the lifecycle of a plant. The children were amazed to see how it all starts as a bean and grows into a full grown plant. As geographers, we explored the differences in climate between England and Kenya. We learnt that England and Kenya have different weather. England is often cool and rainy, with colder winters and mild summers. Because Kenya is on the equator which means it is a hot country. It stays hot all year round and doesn't have seasons like we do. Instead of hot and cold seasons, they have wet and dry seasons. In RE this week, we looked at the Charred cross which is on display at Coventry Cathedral which is a replica of the one Jack Forbes attached together in 1940. We spoke about how the charred cross and the cross of nails carry a lasting significance as signs of peace and reconciliation. They remind visitors that the Blitz was not the end of Coventry or the Cathedral's story. Also, we looked at different symbols that can represent peace as well as having theological or spiritual meaning. In computing this week, we focused on sequences and considered the importance of the order of instructions within a sequence. The children had the opportunity to create sequences using the same instructions but in different orders. After we had created the sequence, they had the chance to test the sequences to see how the different orders affect the outcome using the bee-bots. Well done, Year 2, for another hardworking and busy week. We hope you all have a lovely weekend and look forward to seeing what next week brings. Miss Softic and Miss Bullock

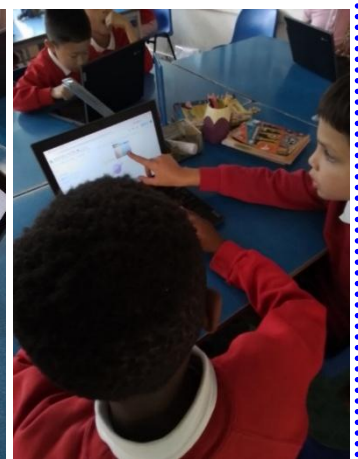
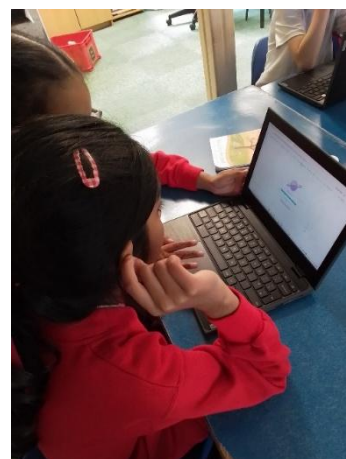


Year 3

It has been a great week of learning in Year 3. As mathematicians, we have been exploring and developing our understanding of different units of time, such as seconds, minutes, hours, days, weeks, and years. To conclude the topic, we solved time-related problems that incorporated the various concepts we had learned. We have started our new topic on shape and having practised what is meant by turns (using north, south, east and west), we moved on to learn about angles and the different types; acute, right and obtuse angles. As writers, we wrote our non-chronological reports about the Empire Windrush. We had lots of interesting facts, included paragraphs based around one theme, and used tier 3 vocabulary. We are continuing to read *Planet Omar: Accidental Trouble Magnet* during our comprehension lessons. This week, we reflected on our thoughts of the story so far and what important lessons it is portraying.

During our P.E lesson, we enjoyed completing our first map orienteering exercise. We learned how to correctly orienteer a map so that it always faces North. We identified the key symbols within a map including start, checkpoints and finish, and even had a timed team challenge to see who could navigate the map the quickest. In our learning of reconciliation in R.E, we discovered how important it is to Jewish worldviews. We learned about Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, and how these important Jewish festivals encourage people to reflect on the past year, seek forgiveness, and make amends with others before the new year begins. We even made our own 'sorry stones' and threw them away to symbolise letting go of the actions. Just like the Jewish tradition of having a sweet treat for a sweet new year, we decorated an apple with an action we could do to make a fresh, kind start to the new year. Well done, Year 3. Have a fantastic weekend.

Year 4

This week, in our English lessons, the children have written a balanced argument about whether schools should close during heatwaves (sadly it isn't as hot now as when we started this writing topic)! The children really impressed us with their writing. They organised their writing into paragraphs; used adverbials of cohesion to link their ideas together; and use a wide range of tier 2 & 3 vocabulary. Great writing – well done Year 4! In maths, the children have started a new unit of learning on shapes, in particular angles (acute, obtuse and right-angles), types of triangles, and turns. As historians, the children learnt about the Viking raids on Britain, such as the one on the monastery at Lindisfarne, and how the Anglo-Saxons reacted to these raids. As scientists, the children have learnt about different types of plants: flowering and non-flowering. We visited The Spinney again – taking photos of different types of plants, including flowering plants, ferns, conifers and mosses. In RE, the children considered what happens when people's world views collide and in computing, the children learnt how to record sounds. This week all the children completed the national Multiplication Tables Check. They all approached it with confidence and demonstrated excellent knowledge of times tables. Well done, Year 4! Their results will be sent out with their end-of-year school report. Next week is healthy schools' week, we have lots of exciting activities planned, including cookery. Thank you if you have already sent in a £1 coin. If you haven't done so yet, please can you, as this will go towards buying the ingredients for our cookery session. Many thanks. Year 5

Year 5 have had a busy and productive week, enjoying lots of exciting learning opportunities. In English, we have been exploring the rainforest and the environmental issues surrounding it. To help us think more deeply about this, we imagined how we would feel if part of our school field was to be sold. We even received an imaginary letter from the governors explaining that it would be developed! Thankfully, this was not real, but it certainly got us thinking. We discussed and recorded the pros and cons of selling part of our school field, which led to some thoughtful conversations. As part of our work as researchers, we have been taking notes in preparation for writing a persuasive leaflet about saving the rainforests. We have learned about deforestation, the importance and benefits of the rainforest, and the threats it currently faces. We have also begun to explore what we can all do to help protect these vital environments. In maths, we have been multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000. We also started a new unit on negative numbers, where we have been completing sequences, as well as ordering and comparing negative numbers. The children have been particularly excited about their computing project this week. After learning a range of filming techniques over the past few weeks, we have now begun planning our adverts. Working in small groups, we have created storyboards and scripts and are looking forward to filming next week.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been working hard on their leaver play. During rehearsals, the children have been working on their acting, timing/delivery of their lines and set design. The class have also impressed me by how quickly they have learnt their lines with some children having mastered multiple parts in such a short space of time. We can't wait to share the performance with you all but we have a long way to go – watch this space!

As writers, the children have been creating an exciting dialogue piece this week. They were given the task to create an engaging interaction between two characters and they had complete freedom in how they were able to do this. Some children chose to write spooky stories about escaping from a school being haunted by a ghostly figure. Others chose to write mysteries where a strange object was discovered which transported their characters to a strange land. I think I was most surprised by one student who chose to write dialogue involving two characters discovering a genie who granted them wishes. The characters in the story chose insurmountable wealth and power which resulted in the collapse of world economies which ended in the familiar, 'be careful what you wish for' line at the very end – I was taken aback by this idea and it truly shows the progress the children have made throughout the year in terms of generating interesting ideas and characters – well done, everyone!

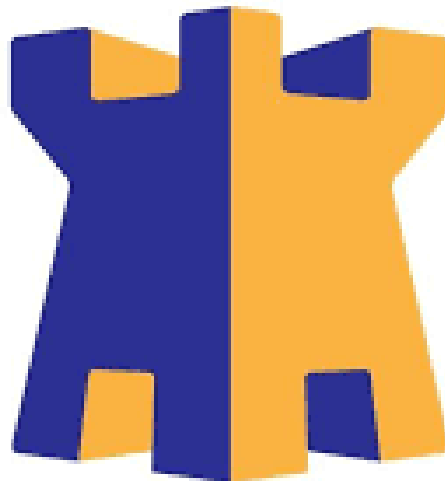
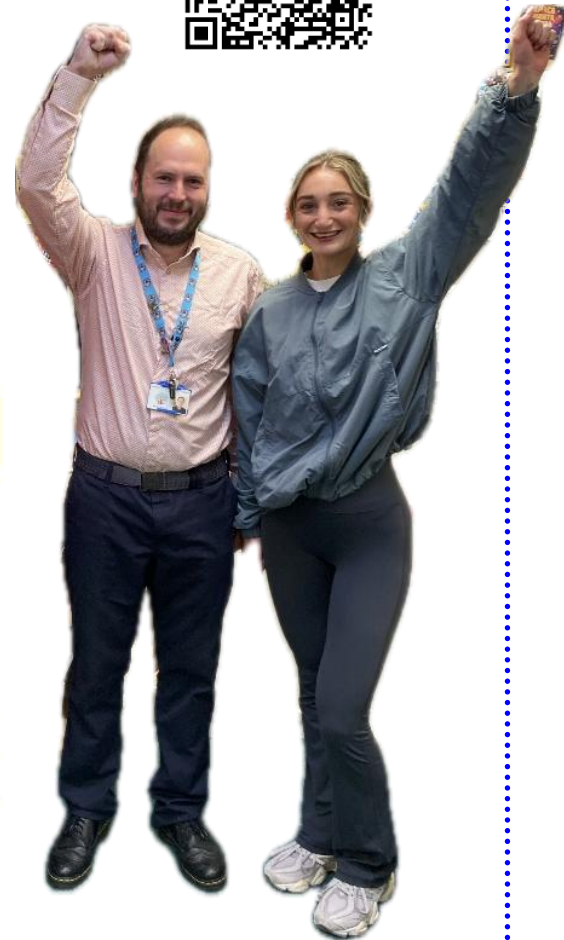
