Each day we have enjoyed a carousel of different activities to support our school values. We showed respect to each other by playing games and taking turns. We encouraged each other and used positive language throughout. We were so proud of the children's interactions with each other and the manners we observed were amazing! We had a great day on Wednesday when we visited Year 1 for the day. Miss Brett & Miss Delargy were amazed with our writing and how we understood and showed the school values throughout the day. 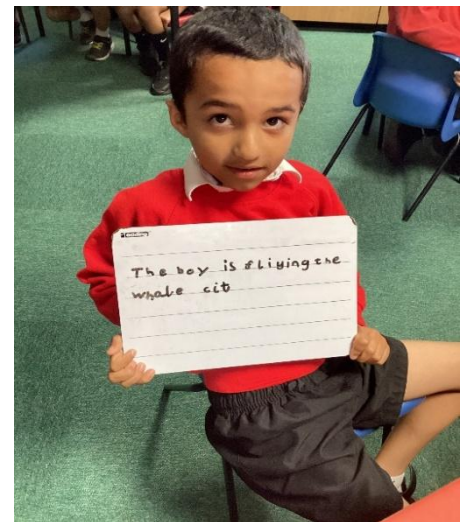
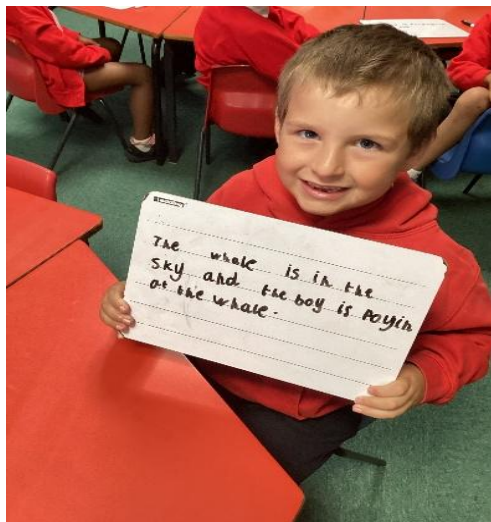
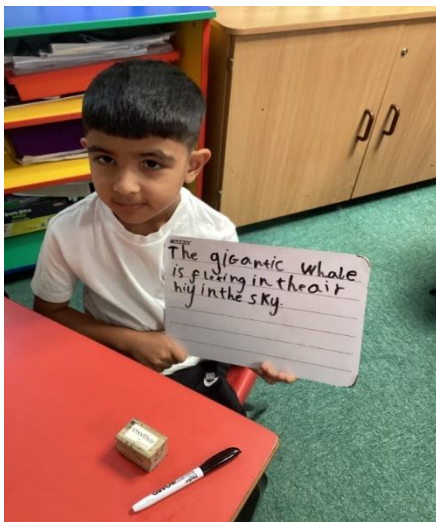

Year 1

We cannot believe how quickly these last few weeks are flying by, and this week has been another fantastic one! It has been Assessment Week, and we have enjoyed completing our final assessment papers of Year 1. We are incredibly proud of how much progress we have all made this year. Everyone has worked so hard and come such a long way in their learning, making tremendous progress along the way. Next week, we will be writing our own journey stories inspired by *The Snail and the Whale*. We are looking forward to using our creativity and storytelling skills to create exciting adventures. In Maths, we have been learning about money. We began by exploring unitising, which is where we learn to group objects into equal sets and count those groups as single units (for example, counting in 2s, 5s or 10s) rather than counting each item individually. This understanding then helped us move on to recognising and counting different coins. In Science, we discussed what happens during the summer season and how we can stay safe while enjoying the warmer weather. We talked about the different activities we can enjoy when the sun is shining, as well as the importance of protecting ourselves from sunburn and dehydration by using sun cream, wearing suitable clothing, drinking plenty of water and taking long breaks in the shade. In RE, we explored the question, *What is a naming ceremony?* We learned that a naming ceremony is a Humanist tradition and a non-religious alternative to a christening or baptism. In computing, we continue to thoroughly enjoy developing our programming skills by creating exciting animations! We really enjoyed spending the day in Year 2 for Transition Day on Wednesday. We had so much fun and did so many fun activities! We cannot believe it is the penultimate week next week and we are so close to starting our Year 2 journey. We are all very excited. Next week, it is supposed to be warmer so please make sure we're bringing in hats, plenty of water and putting on sun cream before school. Year 2

We can't believe that there are only two weeks left of Year 2 – this year has flown by! In English, we began our final unit of the year based on a clip called *The Caterpillar Shoes*. The children thoroughly enjoyed watching the clip and were particularly impressed by the kindness and respect the caterpillar showed as he shared his shoes with the minibeasts he met on his journey. During our phase one lesson, we created a story map to sequence the events of the story, and the children had the opportunity to design and create their own symmetrical butterflies. It was wonderful to see their creativity shine through and to watch them enjoy the activity so much. In Maths, we completed our final topic of the year: Position and Direction. The children focused on describing turns and movement using key vocabulary such as *quarter turn*, *half turn*, *clockwise* and *anticlockwise* when giving and following instructions.

As geographers, the children explored the similarities and differences between the United Kingdom and Kenya. Using the tablets, they researched our learning question and compared a range of geographical features found in each country. The children were fascinated by what they discovered and enjoyed learning lots of new and interesting facts. On Wednesday, the children spent the day with their new teacher, Mrs Nagra, in Year 3. They all returned excited and enthusiastic and are already looking forward to their move to Year 3 in September. In Science, we learned about the different plants that we can eat. The children discovered that fruits, vegetables and herbs grow in the same way as many other plants, beginning as seeds. They learned that plants need water and sunlight to grow and that different parts of the plant develop into the fruits and vegetables we eat. In Computing, the children designed an algorithm to guide their robot around the mat they created during last week's lesson. They carefully planned a route by identifying the starting point and destination, helping them understand exactly what they wanted their program to achieve. Through this activity, they developed their problem-solving and computational thinking skills by planning, sequencing and testing instructions to successfully navigate their robot from start to finish. We have also been busy writing about our time in Year 2 for our reports, which we hope you will enjoy reading with the children's report. Next week is Design and Technology Week in school. Year 2 will be designing and creating their own fridge magnets. To support this learning at home, please encourage your child to investigate any magnets you may have around the house. We would also be grateful if children could bring in any fridge magnets from home on Wednesday so that we can explore and discuss a variety of designs and uses together. We hope you all have a lovely weekend, and we look forward to seeing everyone on Monday. Miss Softic and Miss Bullock



Year 3

And just like that, another week has flown by in Year 3. As mathematicians, we have been continuing to learn about statistics, namely how we can interpret and draw bar charts. If you would like to continue the learning at home, the children could pick a specific topic (e.g. favourite colour, ice-cream flavour etc) and complete a tally chart before putting the results into a pictogram or a bar chart. During our P.E. lesson, we brought together all the football skills we have learned and put them into practice by playing an exciting and highly competitive match. We also continued to develop our orienteering skills, enjoying the challenge of navigating around the school grounds to locate a series of check points. As musicians, we have been rehearsing for our music concert with Miss Brett, and we are excited about performing to you all next week. On Wednesday, we had a fabulous transition day getting to know our Year 4 teachers - Mrs Amphlett and Mr Kelley, and we are all looking forward to starting Year 4 in September. We cannot believe we only have another two weeks in Year 3! As we prepare for the end of term, we have been reflecting on all the exciting learning and memorable experiences we have had throughout the year. We have been busy writing about our time in Year 3 for our reports, which we hope you will enjoy reading next week.

Year 4

As historians, the children have learnt how the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons lived together in the Danelaw period and how it eventually came to an end. As scientists, the class learnt about the terms 'endangered' and 'extinct'. Then they researched an animal that is endangered and the steps that are being taken to protect it. On Tuesday, some of the children went to Warwick University with Miss Cleveland for the culmination of a reading project they have been taking part in this term. There are more details on this in a separate section of the newsletter. On Wednesday, the class spent the day in Year 5 with their new teachers – Mrs Aston, Mrs Reihill and Miss Cleveland. Year 5

Year 5 have had a fantastic week and have certainly appreciated the slightly cooler weather! We have enjoyed joining Year 6 for rehearsals of their end-of-year production. In PE, the children have been developing their rounders skills whilst continuing to improve their health-related fitness through a range of activities. In Computing, we have been busy learning to code using Crumble kits. The skills we are developing will be put to good use in our upcoming Design and Technology project. On Wednesday, the children took part in Transition Day and were excited to spend the day in Year 6 with Mr Young and Mrs Kailey. By all accounts, it was a wonderful experience and has helped the children feel confident and enthusiastic about moving into Year 6 in September. On Thursday, we welcomed Anna and Steve from St John's Church, who led a whole-school assembly. Steve then joined Year 5 for a workshop linked to our RE learning about how religions change over time. Through a series of fun and engaging activities, the children explored the importance of communication and discussed how Christians are inspired to make positive choices by learning about the life and teachings of Jesus in the Bible. In History, we have been learning about King Henry VIII. After researching and making notes, the children used their knowledge to create their own PowerPoint quizzes, which they enjoyed sharing and testing on one another. We are delighted to introduce the newest members of our Year 5 classroom family, Stephen and Stephanie, our stick insects, who are now nearly two weeks old! The children were thrilled to watch them hatch from their eggs and have loved observing how much they have grown in such a short time. They have more than doubled in length already and are much easier to spot moving around in their habitat. Year 6

This week, we have been ramping up the rehearsals and have been refining our performance, adding additional props and choreographing dances for songs. As historians, we re-visited our World War 2 topic and learnt about the life of Anne Frank. The children learnt about her relationship with her diary (named Kitty) and learnt about some of her experiences living inside the Secret Annex with her family and the Van Pels. The children made comparisons between her hobbies and interests with their own and learnt that she had much in common with children of today – she lived her life to the fullest despite the unpleasant circumstances her and her family had to endure. The class then read selected quotes by Anne Frank and deduced that she was an incredibly positive thinker overall and longed for a better future for everyone. It was a thought-provoking lesson that aimed to teach empathy by viewing aspects of World War 2 through 1st hand accounts.

As writers, the class have been putting together their 'My Time in Year 6' pages for their reports and they are excited to share their highlights with you. The children were also asked to think about their hopes and dreams for the future too which should make for a lovely read.

As part of their R.E. topic, the children took part in a workshop with Anna from St John's Church. They learnt about Christian views on life after death and took part in a range of fun games and activities which encouraged them to think about their own views and beliefs - It was a brilliant session and it was wonderful to see children of other faiths (and those who were unsure or without) share comparisons and differences openly.
