### Celebrating our Learning Reception

We are super impressed with how the children have settled into their new routines. They have come in each day with smiles on their faces and have shown enjoyment with everything they have done! This week we have practiced our daily routines, such as lining up, sitting on the carpet ready to learn, washing our hands, choosing our lunches, and putting on and taking off our jumpers and cardigans. (Please make sure these are all named, as it really does help us!) The children have explored and become familiar with the different areas in the classroom and are learning how to use them and keep them tidy when they are finished. We have been very impressed with this!

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The children have had great fun learning and singing the alphabet as well as some familiar nursery rhymes. This week, in our daily phonics lessons we have learnt the sounds 's' and 'a'. We have been practising recognising and saying the sounds as well as forming the letters with pencils, paint, crayons, sand and even play-dough! Keep practising these at home as we will be moving onto two new sounds next week. We also enjoyed our weekly visit to our school library where you child chose a book to bring home and share with you. We have been so impressed with the children's listening skills and focus during our daily maths lessons too. We have been learning about numbers to 5, especially subitising, which helps us recognise amounts without counting! Please send these in each Wednesday so your child can change it for a new one. We have also been practicing writing our names and recognising them when we see them.

Just a reminder about our Early Reading workshop. We look forward to welcoming you all on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> September at 3pm. Please use the main entrance.

### Year 1

What another fantastic week we have had! In English, we have been practising writing neatly on the line and building sentences that make sense. We have also been focusing on using capital letters and full stops correctly to show where a sentence starts and ends. At the end of the week, we wrote our own feelings sentences inspired by *The Colour Monster* and worked hard to include all the skills we have learned so far. In maths, we have continued our learning about Place Value within 10. We have been recognising numbers written as words, counting on from any given number, and finding one more than a number.

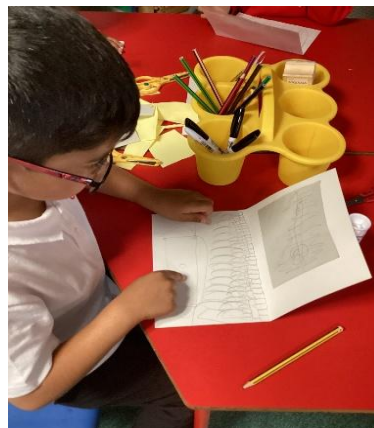
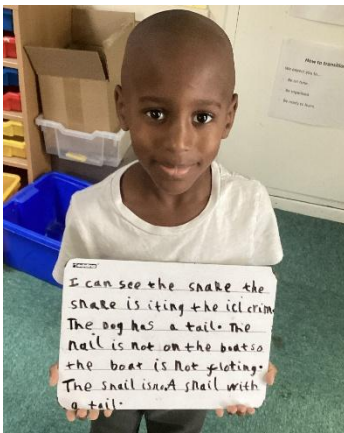
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We have also begun our journey into counting backwards. Next week, we will continue this learning as we start comparing numbers using the language *less than*, *greater than*, and *equal to*. Any support at home with recognising which numbers come before and after each other would greatly benefit us. In science, we helped the Three Little Pigs describe the properties of different materials. We used scientific vocabulary such as *bendy*, *hard*, *shiny*, *transparent*, and *opaque* to describe and compare a range of materials. In computing, we learned the names of the different parts of a computer and discussed what each part does. We then made our own laptops and desktop computers to help us secure our learning. In PSHE, we began our first topic, *All About Me*. We talked about our likes and dislikes and learned that they may be different from those of our friends. We celebrated how everyone is unique and special. In geography, we learned the names of the four countries of the United Kingdom and began exploring what makes each one special. In RE, we recapped our learning about personal worldviews from last week and explored the topic in greater depth. We discussed how our actions and choices can reflect our worldviews. In handwriting, we really enjoyed doing all the different fine motor activities such as making letters out of playdough, picking small objects up with tweezers and pegs, tracing interesting shapes and patterns and using the pegboards. This will help us strengthen the muscles in our hands and support us when we hold and write with a pencil or pen. In Book Talk, we continued our exciting journey into space with Ori. During Thinking Week, we discussed what we know about the story and its characters and practised making inferences by reading between the lines. We ended the week with a PE lesson full of movement and fun! We are very proud of all the hard work we have shown this week! 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### Year 2

What another fantastic week of learning we have had in Year 2! In English, the children have been busy planning and beginning to write a set of instructions on 'How to Train a Dragon', inspired by Julia Donaldson's *Zog*. We have written the openings statement of our instructions and will continue with the remaining steps next week. We have also started our reading comprehension lessons based on the story *The Rainbow Fish*. This week, we focused on retrieval questions, where the children have to find information directly from the text. The children thoroughly enjoyed becoming reading detectives and searching for the answers. It was wonderful to see just how much they could already remember from the story! In maths, we continued our learning about place value. The children explored how two-digit numbers can be partitioned flexibly in different ways. For example,  $50 + 4$  and  $40 + 14$  both make 54. We have also been looking at intervals on a number line and considering which numbers lie between the multiples of 10 on either side. The children used their knowledge of counting in multiples of 10 to help them accurately label number lines. As historians, we have been learning about what caused the Great Fire of London. The children were amazed and intrigued to discover how different a bakery oven would have been in 1666 compared with the ovens we use today. We discussed how the fire began in Thomas Farriner's bakery and how it quickly developed into such a significant historical event. As scientists, the children had a fantastic afternoon exploring our school grounds on Wednesday to investigate the question: 'What plants grow in our local area?' We went on a nature walk and discovered many different species of plants growing around our school. It was lovely to see the children's enthusiasm and excitement, particularly when they spotted and identified a plant they had been looking for. In RE, we learnt about the Incarnation and why it is important to people with Christian worldviews. We learnt that Incarnation refers to the Christian belief that God became human in Jesus, and we explored this further through the Bible story of the Nativity. In computing, the children explored information technology (IT) in the world around us. We discussed how IT can be found almost everywhere, both indoors and outdoors. The children were particularly interested to discover how many different jobs use some form of IT to support people in their roles. Keep up the amazing work, Year 2! We are so proud of all your fantastic learning this week. Have a lovely and well-deserved weekend! Miss Softic, Miss Bullock and Mrs Akthar



### Year 3

We have had another week of exciting learning in Year 3. During our English lessons, we have continued developing the skills needed for successful story writing. This week, we learned how to use inverted commas to punctuate speech and how paragraphs can be used when the time or place changes in a story. As writers, we also began planning and writing our own narratives inspired by *Handa's Surprise*, adding plenty of creative twists to the original tale.

In our maths lessons, we have been working with numbers up to 1,000. We explored how to represent numbers, partition them using the expanded form, and apply flexible partitioning strategies. We will continue revisiting the key concept of place value, understanding that a three-digit number is made up of hundreds, tens and ones. For example, 365 is made up of 3 hundreds, 6 tens and 5 ones.

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During our R.E lesson, we explored whether nature and the changing seasons are important to people with non-religious worldviews. In P.E, we developed our hurdling skills and worked collaboratively in teams to practise and improve our techniques. On Wednesday, we enjoyed a percussion workshop with Miss Brett and had great fun creating music together. As scientists, we investigated how living things obtain their food. We discovered that animals cannot make their own food and must eat plants or other animals in order to survive. Well done, Year 3, we are incredibly proud of you all. ### Year 4

This week, the children have really impressed us with the quality of their writing. They have written their own versions of the story of Romulus and Remus from ancient Roman times. They have included: paragraphs; expanded noun phrases for added descriptive detail; and have used fronted adverbials to start their sentences. Well done Year 4 – fantastic writing. In our maths lessons this week, the class have continued to learn about place value. They have learnt about partitioning numbers up to 10,000; finding 1, 10, 100 or 1000 more or less than a number; and estimating where a number would go on a numberline. Next week, we will be learning about ordering numbers, Roman numerals and rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000. As scientists, the children carried out an experiment to find out if gases weigh anything. First of all, the children weighed a glass of lemonade. Then, they stirred it to make it go flat and weighed it again. They were surprised to find out that the weight of the lemonade had decreased, proving that the carbon dioxide gas in the lemonade did weigh something. In our history lesson, the children learnt about the Roman army and why they were so effective. In computing, the children learnt about what the internet is made of and in RE, they found out why some religions make sacrifices. In their PE lessons week, the children have enjoyed tennis activities and have been doing gymnastics in the hall. To help at home, please can you make sure that your child completes their Lbq and Spelling Shed home learning each week and that they read regularly, completing their reading diary too. Well done, Year 4 – what a good week. Mr Kelley, Mrs Amphlett and Miss Palmer

### Year 5

Year 5 have had a brilliant week of learning. In maths, we have continued to learn about place value, working with numbers up to one million. We have been partitioning, using number lines, comparing and ordering. This has involved playing some dice games to secure our understanding. In English this week, we have been looking at the features of an explanation text. We read through different explanations, highlighting the vocabulary features and how the text is organised. We looked at explanations for machines and inventions. Everyone had a go at designing and explaining a Teacher Pleaser machine! These included tea dispensers, rocking chairs and cuddly toys. If only they were real! We took our learning into the hall to play a game where we had to go to the correct station, depending on whether a sentence was written in past, present or future tense.

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In RE, we learnt that some people with a Christian world view celebrate the incarnation of Jesus, which is why we have Christmas. Both people with or without a Christian world view might have particular traditions at this time. As scientists, we carried out some practical experiments to help us understand the force of gravity. We found out that Sir Isaac Newton discovered gravity, weight is measured in Newtons and this shows the force that is exerted on an object by gravity. Mass is measured in grammes. We used scales and Newton meters to find the mass and weight of different objects. Our geography topic took us on a trip to Tesco this week! We investigated where our food comes from, examining countries of origin, packaging and prices. The children were enthusiastic and enjoyed the chance to go on a local visit to enhance their learning. Well done, Year 5! In PSHE, we discussed social media, thinking about why people use it and the benefits and risks involved. We discussed how important it is to have rules and age limits to protect young people and to make sure they understand the positives and negatives of the online world. ### Year 6

Year 6 have had another brilliant week of learning, showing enthusiasm, imagination and teamwork across the curriculum. It has been wonderful to see the children challenging themselves, sharing ideas and applying their knowledge in practical ways.

As writers, the children have been working incredibly hard on their Batman character descriptions. They have been thinking carefully about powerful vocabulary, expanded noun phrases and how to create atmosphere for the reader. Their writing has shown real attention to detail, with many children using dramatic language to bring Batman and Gotham City vividly to life.

In maths, Year 6 have been developing their confidence with rounding integers. They have practised identifying the correct place value, deciding whether to round up or down, and explaining their reasoning clearly. It has been great to see the children applying these skills accurately and becoming more secure with larger numbers.

Within computing, the children have been learning all about data packets and how information is broken down and sent between computers. To help understand this, they practised sending messages to each other as if they were computers, splitting information into smaller parts and thinking about how each part reaches the correct destination. This hands-on activity helped them understand how digital communication works in the real world.

In science, Year 6 have been gathering data about where mini beasts enjoy living around our school grounds. The children explored different habitats, made careful observations and considered why certain areas might be more suitable for different creatures. Their investigation encouraged them to think like scientists by collecting evidence and using it to answer questions about living things and their environments.

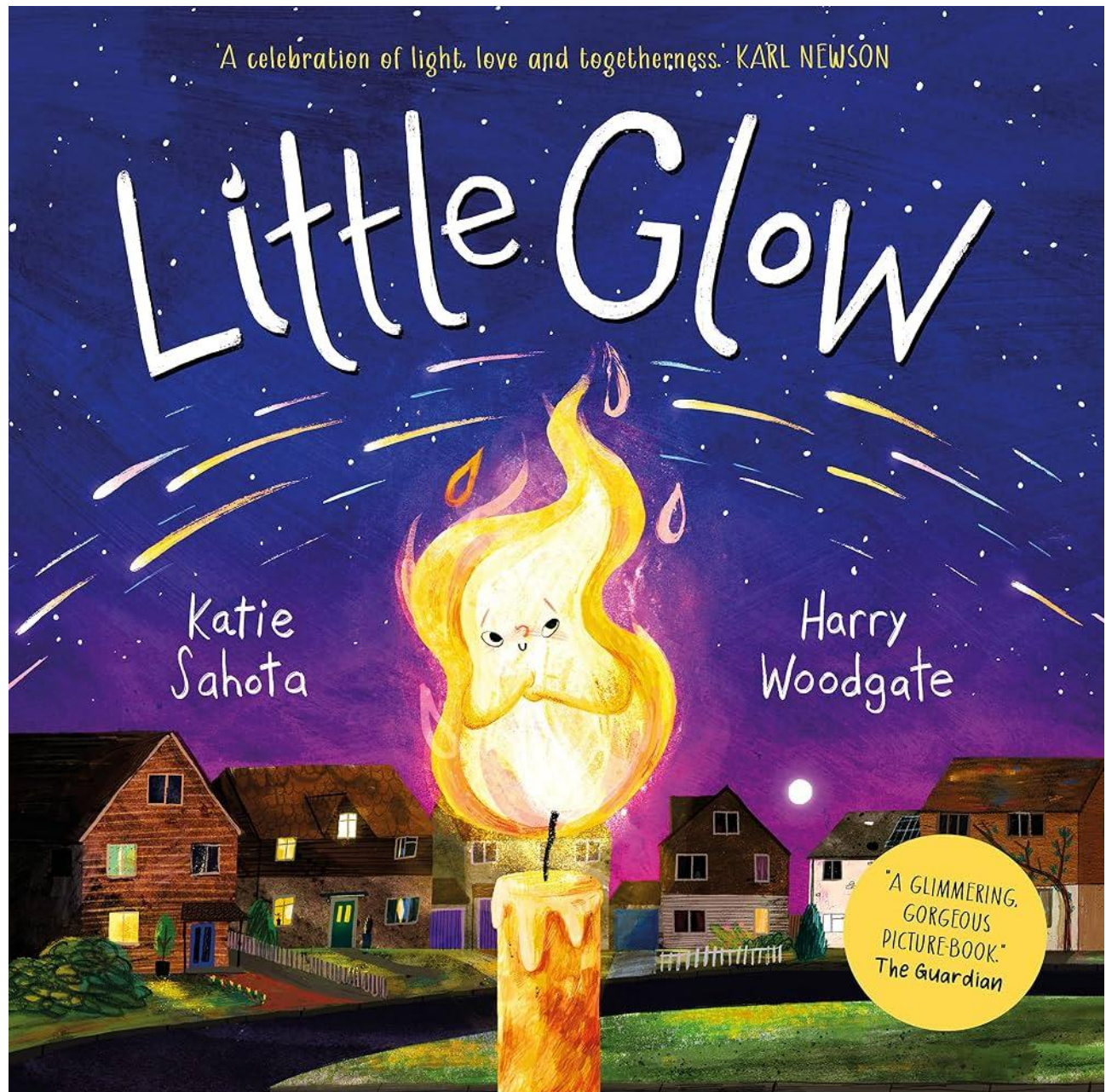

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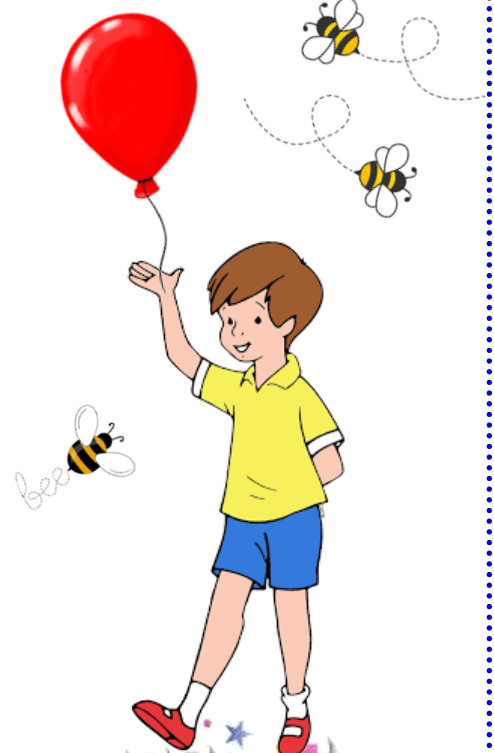
